#### Pastor's Note

Dear parishioners and friends of Our Lady's,

The parish's celebration of my installation as pastor last weekend was a great event for all of us at Our Lady of Sorrows in Sharon. Even though it was a holiday weekend, the Mass drew 150 participants. The presence of the Knights of Columbus made the liturgy solemn; the music made the church uplifting; the presence of the people made it a celebration. Bishop Robert Reed made it possible for all of us to feel the presence of God and our responsibilities as stewards of the vineyard. I was moved and touched by the Holy Spirit when putting my right hand on the Gospel and taking the oath of fidelity.

All the following thanks, which come from the bottom of my heart, I planned to express at the celebration. In the end, I did not deliver these remarks during the Mass because the bishop and I took on the same topic: "*No Anxiety*" as Paul mentioned in the second reading. I still want to let you know how grateful I am to God and to you, the members of our parish community. I give thanks to God for the vocation to be a priest; I thank His Eminence Cardinal Seán for appointing me to be your pastor; I thank Bishop Reed for his ministry and his encouraging and motivational homily; I thank Fr. Frank and Fr. Kevin for their pastoral presence; and I thank the parish staff and the members of our Pastoral and Finance Councils who provide me help and guidance. Most importantly, I thank you in a special way:

I thank you, members and friends of this parish community, the faithful stewards of the vineyard of God, for accepting me as your priest. I am so grateful to all of you who opened your arms to welcome me. I ask you to keep me in your prayers always so that I will be able to serve you well. I am ready.

Since we are all stewards of this very vineyard, I want to reiterate some of Paul's words from the second reading: "Rejoice in the Lord always, say it again, Rejoice!" Let our kindness be known to all. The Lord is indeed with us: have no anxiety, in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make our requests known to God: Enrich our Faith, Strengthen Our Community. Get involved with church activities because **Service** to our parish is a critical aspect of evangelization. Always take care of our parish by contributing our Time, Talent, Treasure and Testimony. Together, we work for the day when all of us will form a community of Christ united in Love and service. We walk with Jesus.


#### <u>Memorial Mass</u> November 5th at 11 AM


#### **Breakfast Donations for Mainspring House**


