Pastor's Note

Dear parishioners and friends of Our Lady's,

Are we familiar with this Scriptural passage? "Who of you, if your son asks for bread, will give him a stone? Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a snake? ...How much more will your Father in heaven give good gifts to those who ask him?" (Mt 7:9-12) Even though we do not know these words well, I know for sure that all parents always try to provide the best for their children.

To prepare for last Sunday's coffee hour talk, "From Qingdao (Tsingtao) to Sharon," I mentally revisited my child-hood looking for God's presence in my life. Honestly speaking, I did not see much of God's presence. During my boyhood, I did not engage in conversation with God, and neither did I have any extraordinary spiritual experiences. Instead, when I recall my childhood years, what I see clearly is the way my mother brought me to God. When I was little, I listened to her. (I always say that, back then, I was a nearly perfect boy). My mother was happy with me and taught me to pray. When I became a teenager, I started to resist prayer and even rebelled against her teaching me about our faith. Like many other boys, I began to think that faith had nothing to do with life. My mother was terribly upset, yet continued to remind me in a rather serious tone that the Catholic faith was a Chen family tradition! A tradition that needed to be kept. She was very serious about her faith. The first and only time she spanked me happened when I refused to see the visiting priest to confess my sins and receive my First Communion.

Friends, my faith became alive because of my mother's persistence and my sisters' help. The grace of God started to nurture my being, and I began to walk with God. I have been a happy priest for over 28 years now. About half a century after I tried to run away from my faith, I still can see my mother's tearful face and hear her trembling voice. As a boy, I did not know any better. I really pushed my mother to the breaking point. "I'm sorry, Mom, that I did that to you. Thank you, Mom, for bringing me back to God." I never had an opportunity to apologize to her when she was alive. Now, I feel much better. Thank you, everyone at Our Lady of Sorrows, for giving me the opportunity to share my faith and to apologize to my mother who is resting in God's eternal peace. We pray that our faith may be strengthened and we never push God to His breaking point. My mother gave me the best food in the whole world.


Continue the Conversation

All are welcome. We spend a few minutes at the beginning of each meeting introducing ourselves, so if you haven't come before, don't be shy! We are always glad to see new faces.




Breakfast Donations for Mainspring House
