Pastor's Note

Dear parishioners and friends of Our Lady's,

A teaching Mass was offered to our 4th through 8th grade faith formation students and their families at 5 pm this last Sunday, the first Sunday of Advent. Deacon Matthew Harrington gave a beautiful explanation of the entire Mass to those who were present. He explained everything: the prayers that the priest says while dressing for the celebration of the Mass, the purpose of listening to the readings, the meaning of the Eucharist, and the mission we are undertaking as we leave after the Mass. His talk not only refreshed my understanding of the entire Mass, but also helped me deepen my love for the Eucharist. In the Eucharist, God and ourselves become one.


The image of the Cross that Deacon Matthew used to explain our relationship with God and with one another in the celebration of the Mass reminds me of the importance of the Eucharist in the life of Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta and her community. In the sacristy of every community in Mother Teresa's order, there is a sign with these words: "Priest of God, celebrate this Mass as if it is your first Mass, your last Mass and your only Mass." Mother Teresa's life was not her own life, but rather Jesus lived in her and worked through her. Because of her daily reception of the Eucharist, Mother Teresa was able to do all things in Jesus, for Jesus, and with Jesus. Over the years, I have recalled Mother Teresa's example often, both as a way of reminding myself of the importance of the Eucharist and as a way of stirring up love of and devotion to the Eucharist among the seminary students I taught in China.

Friends, although as Catholics we have a good intellectual understanding of the Church's teaching that the Holy Mass and Communion are inseparable from our everyday life, many of us still lack physical and spiritual enthusiasm for coming to church to participate in that very celebration. In order for us to make some progress in putting our faith into action this year, I want to invite all of us to pay some attention, first of all, to the meaning of the four candles on Advent Wreath. The first candle is called the Prophet's Candle and represents HOPE; the second candle is called the Bethlehem Candle and represents PEACE; the third candle is called the Shepherd's Candle and represents JOY; and the fourth candle is called the Angel's Candle and represents LOVE. The burning of these candles inspires us to bring Hope, Peace, Joy and Love into our world which greatly needs all of these things. I also invite us to think of Mary and John the Baptist this Advent. As the expectant mother of Jesus, Mary was humble and obedient. As the herald of the coming Messiah, John was fearless as he prepared people for the first Advent. They were real people in action. With God's blessing, we can also be people who put our faith into action.




