How Can the Church Evangelize During the Digital Age?

In the time of Jesus, there were very few ways to spread the Good News of Christ. The only way to hear the Good News was listening directly to Jesus or his disciples. Today, we can continue to share the Good News with family, at church, and depending on the person, at school. We also have many more opportunities to spread Jesus' teachings. One tool that could be utilized for this is social media. This can happen through countless different apps or websites, and the news can come from both adults and teenagers. The Church can evangelize during the digital age by creating accounts that share inspirational lessons, by creating social media pages to advertise Jesus inspired clothing, and using a social media page to advertise church and community groups.

One way that the church can evangelize during the digital age is by creating accounts that share inspirational words, bible quotes, and stories. We see an example of this already through an instagram account called "Trustgodbro". This account posts motivational words that help bring people closer to Jesus. It also shares particular bible quotes for those dealing with specific issues. This account shares posts reminding people to be thankful. They did this on Thanksgiving, for example. These instagram pages are easy to set up and relatively easy to manage. It would be easy for a teenager, as well as an adult to set one up. By doing this, you are both spreading the Good News of God, and also living it. Building on the example of "Trustgodbro" is one way the Church can evangelize in the digital age.

Another way the church can evangelize during the digital age is by creating clothing with the words of the Bible or Jesus on it. One of the easiest ways to advertise and sell this clothing would be through social media. We already see an example of this in the company He Would Love First. They advertise such items as hoodies, shirts, bracelets and hats on social media. The clothing and bracelets share phrases such as "WWJD", and "Love never gives up." The company could promote their wear and evangelize by sharing these clothes with those in nursing homes or homeless shelters, especially around the holidays. Considering this may be hard to do, an alternative would be having a discount for those who are ill or in rehab facilities.

A third way that the church can evangelize during the digital age is by using social media to advertise church and community groups. These groups are normally directed at teenagers or other young followers of Christ who are on social media. On platforms such as Instagram, Facebook and Twitter, there are social media pages advertising certain church groups. Some of these groups even have a team of teenagers that runs and organizes their social media page. These groups share fun and relatable ways to grow in a relationship with God. By creating one of these pages to advertise a church group, we are growing in your relationship with God, and also helping others to grow.

In conclusion, there are many different ways the Church can grow and spread the Good News with the help of social media. These ways include creating accounts that share inspirational lessons and bibles quotes, creating a social media page to advertise clothing with the words of Jesus, and finally using social media to creatively advertise church groups to the young. By evangelizing through social media in the digital age, the Church reminds young people that the words of Jesus are just as relevant today as they were many years ago.


