

Pastor's Note

Dear parishioners and friends of Our Lady's,

This week's daily readings from the Book of Ezra have provided me with much to reflect on, including how King Cyrus of Persia was inspired by the Lord to set the Jews free to rebuild their homes. The Jews' return to their homeland was not easy. The prophet Ezra, exiled along with his fellow Jews, accurately recorded the return of God's faithful people and their efforts to rebuild Jerusalem. Again, the rebuilding of Jerusalem was difficult. Still, "Ezra had set his heart on the study and practice of the law of the LORD and on teaching statutes and ordinances in Israel" (Ezra 7:10).


Inspired by the prophet Ezra, I want to share how I personally connect with these readings. Like Ezra, with the prayers of the people, I was healed by God. The experience of being in exile, feeling abandoned by God, is simply horrible. For a stranger to tell suffering people to keep up HOPE, to PRAY always, and be GOOD to others because God is near to you is like ridicule. I heard a lot during my 18 years of pain and suffering (1992-2010). Over the years I visited many kinds of doctors in the U.S. and in Beijing. I tried all sorts of physical therapies, including different acupunctures. Not only did I ask people to pray for me (my mother prayed the rosary for me twice a day), but also I went to numerous prayer gatherings. Nothing seemed to help but ibuprofen, Tylenol and Advil.

Surprisingly, I was healed in the fall of 2010, after a few invitations and a good confession. I confessed just like Ezra confessed sin on behalf of his people, expressing his shame, grief, and repentance by saying, "O my God, I am ashamed and blush to lift my face to you, my God, for our iniquities have risen higher than our heads, and our guilt has mounted up to the heavens" (Ezra 9:6).

Friends, Isaiah's description of God's ways is indeed true: "My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways" (Is 55:8). To be frank, I was not a saint, but a regular person with flesh. Because of my deteriorating health, my life had become dull, my prayer had become dry, and my world had become smaller and smaller. It seemed that God had turned a deaf ear to my cries. At one point, I even begged God to take me as soon as possible, praying every night before bedtime: "Lord, take me tonight while I sleep. If I wake up tomorrow morning, I will continue to work. Help me." Faith kept reminding me to take up my cross and follow Jesus, to walk through the valley of the shadow of death and fear not (Psalm 23). Let me invite you to also put your trust in God and, in doing so, Enrich Our Faith and Strengthen Our Community.



Protecting God's Children Training




Church in Action is hosting a one day mission on November 10th in Hopkinton, MA. This is open to all middle school students.






