# 30th Sunday in Ordinary Times October 26, 2025

By all signs, the Pharisee is a laudable person. He fasts, he gives alms, he visits the temple and prays. In other words, he practices the three traditional works of the faith. But his self-righteous attitude puts him in the wrong relationship with God. He has no sense of needing God for anything. He doesn't thank God for the grace to be a good person, but with disdain for people who sin. That the Pharisee "spoke this prayer to himself" could merely mean he is not speaking it aloud, but it's also the case that he's addressing himself more than God (Luke18:11). He seems to be patting himself on the back more than thanking God with sincere gratitude. When we become too full of ourselves, too convinced that we are the reason for our own goodness, we forget our own humanity. We forget that we are flawed creatures in need of forgiveness and mercy.

In general, tax collectors at this time were regarded as collaborators and thieves. They collected taxes imposed by the Roman government and generally padded their income by extorting more than what their neighbors really owed. No wonder they were despised, especially by pious people like the Pharisee. But at least the tax collector in the parable is self-aware. He recognizes his sinfulness. He trusts that God's mercy is stronger than his sin. We are not told what he did once he returned home. Perhaps he stopped extorting his fellow citizens. Perhaps he paid back his ill-gotten gains. Perhaps he resigned his position. But Jesus tells us that just by virtue of his simple, honest plea to God, he became justified and would be exalted.

It is ironic that the Pharisee contrasted himself to "the rest of humanity" (Luke 18:11), for this is exactly whom Jesus came to save. In fact, it is for the sake of sinners that Jesus became poor, humbling himself to share in our humanity. The Pharisee's attitude leads him to place himself above God, unable to "pierce the clouds" with his prayer (Sirach 35:17).

Question of the Week: In what sense am I poor, in need of God's grace? Do I recognize this poverty when I pray?

# October 7, 2025 Corpus Christi Meeting Minutes

The Corpus Christi Council met on Tuesday, October 7<sup>th</sup> at St Patrick's. Council members present included Father David, Aaron K., Bob B., Brooke K., Susan O., and Cole B.

The meeting was called to order at 7:04pm by Council president, Aaron. Father David led the group in prayer.

The meeting's agenda was reviewed.

The council welcomed its newest member, Cole Bruch, who will be taking over Bob's position as Bob's term has concluded.

A copy of the August meeting minutes was provided and reviewed. Bob made a motion to approve the minutes and this was seconded by Susan.

## Old Business:

Hispanic Outreach was discussed. Bob provided details from a Spanish Mass that he attended while in California. The group would like to continue personally welcoming and inviting members of the Hispanic community to our church and events.

Scholarship opportunities were reviewed. Current account and funds were discussed amongst the group. The group reviewed that the funds may be utilized for college scholarships, as well as to support attendance of NCYC and CYC events. Bob made a motion to continue to maintain scholarship account funds as well as maintaining the current process for reviewing scholarship requests. This motion was voted all in favor by the CCC members. There was one funding request for Catholic Youth Camp. The group voted all in favor of fulfilling the funding request for CYC.

The Eucharistic procession in Audubon was discussed. There were an estimated 200 people in attendance. Aaron informed the group that the Diocese was pleased with the event. The group discussed hosting future processions and the possibility of making it an annual event. In the future, it would be encouraged for members of the parish to invite a guest to join them in attending the procession.

Aaron updated the group on the process for high school students to obtain silver cord hours. There were several high school students that obtained hours by assisting with the Eucharistic procession. The group discussed the possibility of having students provide input and assistance with updating the current cemetery mapping. This would be discussed further if there was interest from students.

# **New Business:**

Aaron completed a continuity book outlining the objectives of the Corpus Christi Council and the expectations for council members. The booklet also includes information about annual events that are sponsored by the CCC. A paper draft was distributed for review. The council decided that the reference booklet should also include information regarding the role of the director of evangelization.

Susan presented a request to the council regarding the order that the church announcements and the summary of mass are read. It was suggested that readers should present church announcements prior to reading the mass summary. The proposal aims to ensure that the announcements are presented first which then assists members of the congregation to direct their attention to the mass service following the summary of mass. The council discussed this change with Father David. A motion was made to make this change, and it was seconded by Bob. Aaron will send the update to the church office for printing and distribution to the reader.

No remarks were submitted in the comment boxes of either parish.

Father David will be out of the office from October 20<sup>th</sup>- November 20<sup>th</sup> as he travels home to Ghana. Daily mass will not be available during this time.

The next CCC meeting will be held at Holy Trinity on December 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Adoration mass will take place on November 1st.

With no further topics to discuss, council president Aaron adjourned the meeting at 7:10 PM.

The group closed the meeting by reciting the Hail Mary.
