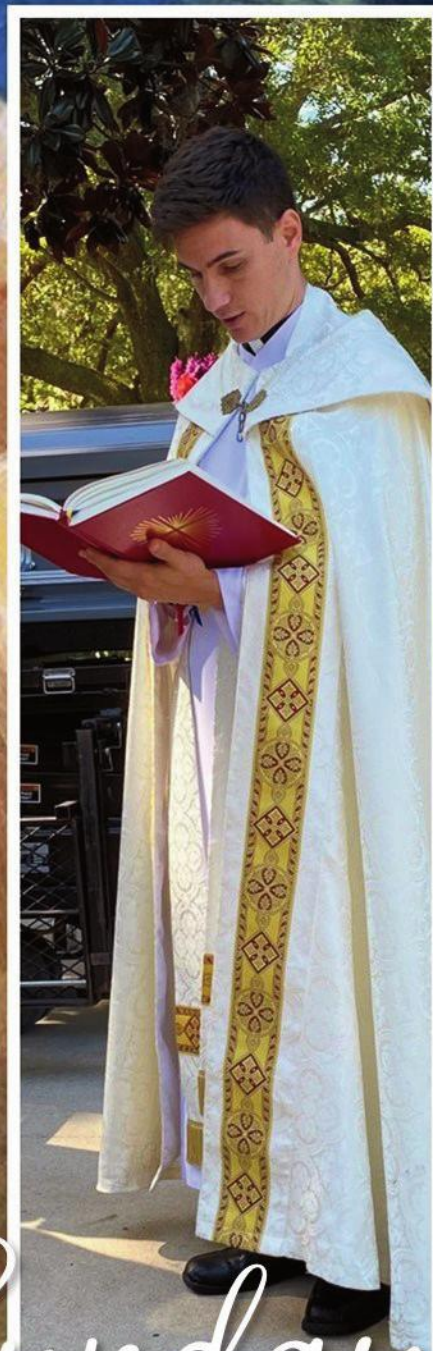
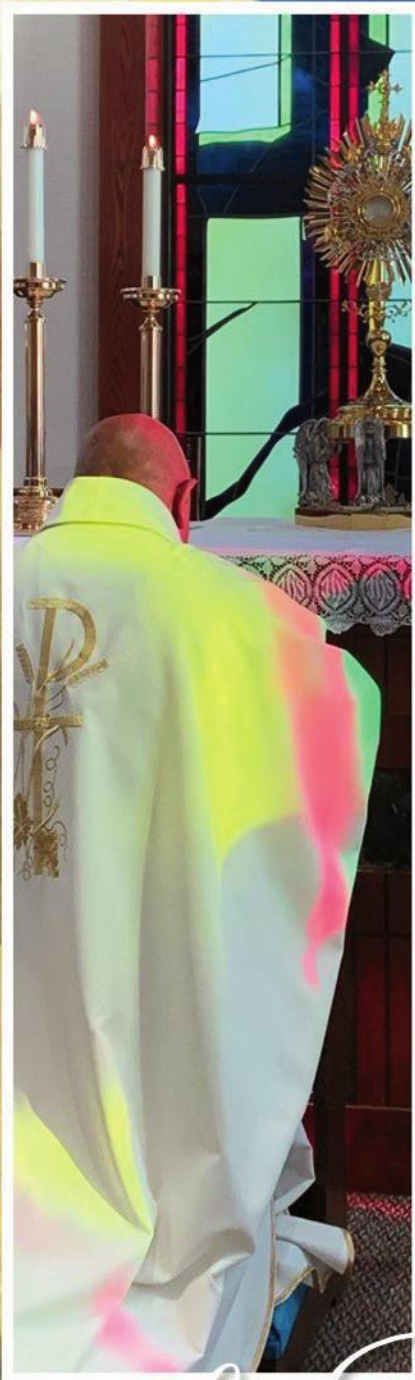
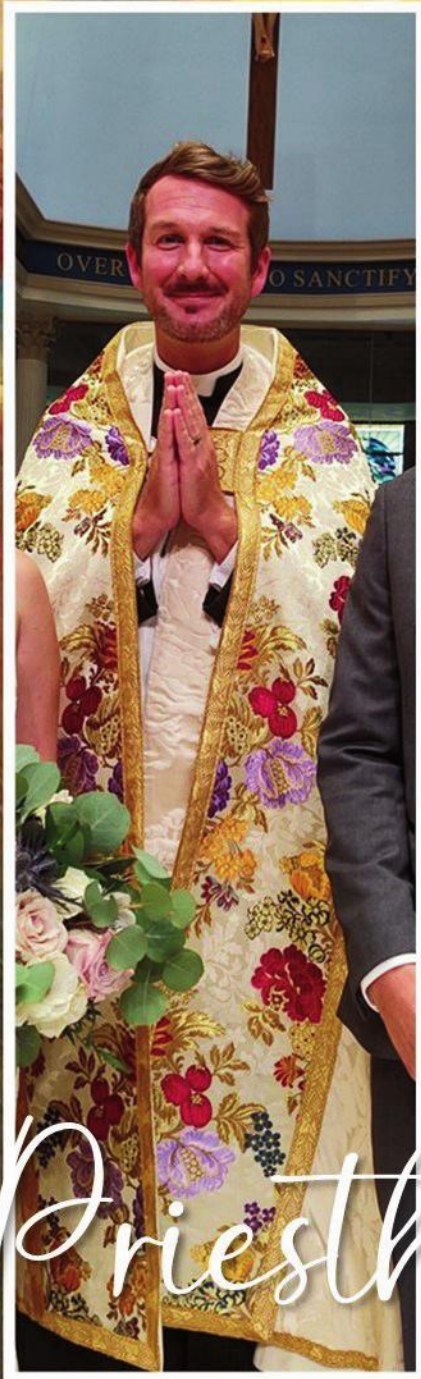

A Note from Fr. Briggs

September 25, 2022—Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family,

"To fall in love with God is the greatest of romances, to seek him the greatest adventure, to find him the greatest human achievement." As we celebrate Priesthood Sunday on the last Sunday in September, these words of Saint Augustine resonate in my heart with deep emotion. The theme of the priesthood is one of those topics that should never be removed from the reflection of the people of God; indeed, it is, in the words of Saint John Vianney, the patron of parish priests, "a sacrament which seems to relate to no one among you, and which yet relates to everyone." This is because the priesthood is a true gift from God to the world. In the words of the same Saint John Vianney, "The priest is not a priest for himself; he does not give himself absolution, he does not administer the sacraments to himself. He is not for himself; he is for you."

Yes, the ministerial service of the priest is a glimpse of God's love for man and the irrevocable will of the Lord "who desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth" (1Tm 2:4). Presence of Christ in his Church, tireless preacher of the Gospel and teacher of Christian life, the priest is also the fruitful father of the "new man" who springs from baptism, the vehicle of divine consolation for the sick, and the expression of God's concern for the poor and defenseless. From his consecrated hands the faithful receive the benefits of divine mercy, capable of relieving man from the scourge of sin and freeing him from slavery: By pronouncing the sacrosanct words of consecration, he perpetuates the true, real, and substantial Presence of Jesus Christ on the altar of our world and ensures the souls of the elect are prepared for their final departure from this earth.

From these truths, I ask (and rather urge) each of you,

dear brothers and sisters in the Lord, to two lofty tasks this Sunday: First, to pray for us priests, who are weak sinners, overly aware of our own humanity and individual limitations, that placed always under the protection of Our Lady, Mother of Priests, we may more closely configure ourselves to the priesthood of her Divine Son.



Second: The pastoral care of vocations, the promotion and support of young people in their vocational discernment is one of the greatest exigencies of today's ecclesial pastoral care. Most priests are overworked and there are many areas of pastoral life uncovered. Church communities need a greater number of priests and *holy* priests in order to respond adequately to the manifold pastoral needs of the Church. But it is indispensable not only to pray for priestly vocations, but that those in charge of the education of young people — priests, religious, catechists, religion teachers, and parents — collaborate with the Lord in the magnificent task of promoting priestly vocations, as mediators between God who calls children and young people who receive this call. The absolute priority is that of prayer for vocations so that the Lord of the harvest may send workers into his harvest (cf. Mt 9:37-38).

May God bless each of you abundantly this week and always,

DID YOU KNOW?

*On September 3, 1965, Pope Paul VI published the encyclical *Mysterium Fidei* on the doctrine and worship of the Holy Eucharist. It was an unprecedented document, issued during the Second Vatican Council. It was also an urgent document because it provided the necessary doctrinal foundation for the Council's Historic Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy. Over the next few weeks, we will look at small pieces of this encyclical.*

"Moreover, the Catholic Church has held firm to this belief in the presence of Christ's Body and Blood in the Eucharist not only in her teaching but in her life as well, since she has at all times paid this great Sacrament the worship known as "latria," which may be given to God alone. As St. Augustine says: "It was in His flesh that Christ walked among us and it is His flesh that He has given us to eat for our salvation; but no one eats of this flesh without having first adored it . . . and not only do we not sin in thus adoring it, but we would be sinning if we did not do so." (MF 55)

"Por lo demás, la Iglesia católica, no sólo ha enseñado siempre la fe sobre a presencia del cuerpo y sangre de Cristo en la Eucaristía, sino que la ha vivido también, adorando en todos los tiempos sacramento tan grande con el culto latréutico que tan sólo a Dios es debido. Culto sobre el cual escribe san Agustín: "En esta misma carne [el Señor] ha caminado aquí y esta misma carne nos la ha dado de comer para la salvación; y ninguno come esta carne sin haberla adorado antes..., de modo que no pecamos adorándola; antes al contrario, pecamos si no la adoramos."

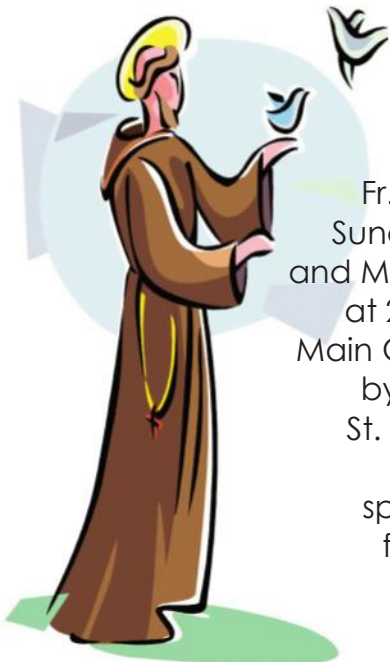

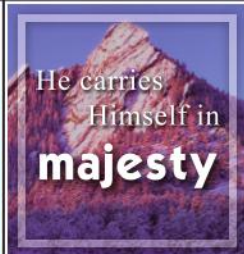
