We are continuing in Pope St. John Paul II's encyclical, *Ecclesia de Eucharistia*, given to us on Holy Thursday in 2003. It builds on many of the concepts of Mysterium Fidei published directly after Vatican II.

Pastor's Notes

FEBRUARY 5, 2023

Dear Parish Family,

In today's Gospel, Christ tells us, "You are the salt of the earth." Salt preserves and enhances the taste of food, just as Christians are called to preserve and sanctify the whole of humanity. This is fundamentally a baptismal reality. In the old rite of Baptism of Infants, the priest would bless salt and place it in the child's mouth, saying, "Receive the salt of wisdom; may it be unto thee a sign of reconciliation unto life everlasting" (trans. Weller). Salt, like water, points to the identity of the baptized and the difference our Baptism should make.

This past Sunday, we had our first luncheon for families with newly baptized children at the parish. While the sacrament of Baptism itself only happens once for each of us, our baptismal dignity as Christians is worth celebrating and remembering throughout life. The Second Vatican Council states that all Christians share "a common dignity as members [of the Church] from their regeneration in Christ, having the same filial grace and the same vocation to perfection; possessing in common one salvation, one hope and one undivided charity" (Lumen Gentium, 32). I am grateful to St. Anne's Circle and everyone who helped make this event a success, giving us another great opportunity to celebrate this wonderful sacrament!

Thanks also to all those who came out to our St. Joseph's Night at the Jacksonville Icemen this past Friday. It was a great opportunity for good hockey, fellowship, and hearing members of our awesome choir sing "God Bless America" on the big stage! We are grateful to the Icemen organization and everyone who helped with this fundraiser benefitting our St. Joseph's Youth Ministry.

Blessings for everyone this week and especially as we come nearer to the beginning of Lent!

Your parish Priests and Deacons understand the pain of those for whom divorce seemed the only recourse. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) encourages divorced persons who wish to marry in the Catholic Church to seek counsel about existing options that may remedy their marital situation, including the suitability of an annulment when there is no longer any hope of reconciliation of the spouses.

An annulment is a declaration by the Diocesan Tribunal (a local Catholic church court) that a marriage thought to be valid according to Church law actually fell short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union. The Boy Scouts of America annually celebrates its official founding on February 8, 1910, based on the program started by Lord Baden Powell in England in August of 1907. The Scout Sunday tradition was started in the mid-1940s to make people in houses of worship aware of Scouting, and to allow Scouts to live out their "Duty to God" pledged each week. The Scout Law says that a "Scout is Reverent," and Scouts of all ages promise to do their "Duty to God." These values strengthen youth character in their family, community, and faith.

The Sunday that falls on or before February 8th is designated as Scout Sunday, which is the primary date to recognize the contributions of young people and adults to Scouting.



Cub Scout Pack 473 and Scouts BSA Troops 0473 and 9473 come

together on this special day to show support for one another and to acknowledge the Catholic faith and unity with our Lord Jesus Christ.

DIVINE MERCY

The Seven Secrets of Divine Mercy by Flynn



St. Faustina's Diary begins with a reference (Diary #1) to Jesus' command that she paint an Image of Him. The Divine Mercy Image is not just a picture of Jesus. He wanted to make His Mercy VISIBLE. At first glance, the Image is of the Merciful Jesus ... but it is more! Pope St. John Paul II writes, "He, Himself ... is Mercy. To the person who sees it in Him – and finds it in Him – God becomes "visible" as THE FATHER WHO IS RICH IN MERCY (Rich in Mercy #2).

Jesus' right hand is extended and cupped to the right in the gesture of a blessing. Thus, the Image reveals the Father to us as the source of divine blessing.

Jesus' left hand is touching His garment at the breast with the garment slightly

drawn aside (to invite us into His Heart). From beneath the garment, two rays are emanating: one red and the other pale, causing us to recall when the Roman soldier pierced Christ's side and Blood and Water gushed out. The pale ray stands for the Waters of Baptism as well as the Sacrament of Confession, which is an extension of Baptism. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls [ie: the Eucharist, "This is the chalice of my Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins." (Roman Missal 90)].

"When you go to Confession, to this fountain of My mercy, the Blood and Water which come forth from My Heart always flows down upon your soul and ennobles it" (Diary 1602).
