Dear Parish Family,

It is hard to believe we have already entered the month of February and the winter months will soon be over. In just a couple of weeks, our hearts and minds will be called to focus upon the monumental moments of Lent. This year, Ash Wednesday falls on February 22. On that day, I invite you to celebrate Mass with us at 8:00 a.m., noon, or 7:00 p.m. in the Main Church. We will have Stations of the Cross at 7:00 p.m. each Friday during Lent, also in the Main Church. Confession will be available at this time. Stations of the Cross is a powerful prayer in which we can all walk alongside our Lord as He labors towards His crucifixion and subsequent death. These moments, which lead us through the streets of Jerusalem, focus the heart and mind on the unending love God has for each of us. The Stations should invoke a sense of sadness and grief within all of us, but at the same time, a deep sense of hope and peace, for through the actions of Christ, we are healed and the true meaning of our existence is revealed.

The Men's Club and Knights of Columbus are each planning Friday night Fish Fries during Lent. These are always a big success. Please monitor the bulletin for more details.

Our Lenten Parish Mission, featuring Fr. Frank DeSiano, will take place on March 6, 7, and 8 in the Main Church at 7:00 p.m. Confession will be available each evening following the Mission talk. Fr. Frank will give an abbreviated Mission talk following the 8:00 a.m. daily Mass in the Historic Church on each of those days. Please see the bulletin for more information.

This year, we will be celebrating the feast of St. Joseph on March 18 at the 5:30 p.m. Vigil Mass. Bishop Pohlmeier will preside at the Mass. I hope all of you will join us. Following the Mass, we will have a reception in the courtyard. I would like to thank our Parish Council president, Michael Broach, who is working with our many ministries, to

provide the food and drink for this reception.

Your parish Priests and Deacons understand the pain of those for whom divorce seemed the only recourse. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) encourages divorced persons who wish to marry in the Catholic Church to seek counsel about existing options that may remedy their marital situation, including the suitability of an annulment when there is no longer any hope of reconciliation of the spouses.

An annulment is a declaration by the Diocesan Tribunal (a local Catholic church court) that a marriage thought to be valid according to Church law actually fell short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union. Come...join your fellow adorers for 40 hours of beautiful, peaceful, life-changing Eucharistic Adoration. From Sunday night (2/19) to Tuesday evening (2/21), we will have 40 hours of Adoration in the Cody Center Chapel (Ash Wednesday is February 22).

The 40-hour Adoration devotion has been a part of Catholic culture for over 500 years. It began in Milan in the early 1500's. By 1550, St. Philip Neri and St. Ignatius Loyola had also instituted this practice, especially for the reparation of sin.

In the U.S., St. John Neumann, the fourth bishop of Philadelphia, was a strong promoter of the 40-hour Adoration devotion. He instituted it in 1853 to combat the violence against the Catholic community in his city.

This pre-Lent devotion is a great way to prepare your heart, and the heart of our parish community, for the 40 days of Lent.

DIVINE MERCY

The Seven Secrets of Divine Mercy by Flynn & St. Faustina's Diary

Jesus' left foot is slightly forward of his right foot and seems to indicate a walking forward position. He is always seeking us, moving toward us, wanting to be close to us.

St. Faustina saw a gentle loving, merciful expression on His Face, with eyes slightly downward as from the Cross. The artists could never capture 'that look' but Jesus told her "Not in the beauty of the color, nor of the brush lies the greatness of this Image, but in My Grace" (Diary 313). We need to ask for the grace to look beyond

the painted Image and see the actual face of Christ, see His loving gaze.

Jesus also instructed St. Faustina regarding the Image; "Souls that say this chaplet will be embraced by My Mercy during their lifetime and especially at the hour of their death" (Diary 754). "I am offering people a vessel with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of mercy. That vessel is this image with the signature "Jesus, I trust in You" (Diary 1578) at the bottom of the painting.

Remember, the Divine Mercy Image is to be treated as an icon that helps us enter into Jesus' Heart. The best way is to receive the Mercy which pours forth from His Heart to us with gratitude and by placing our trust in Him!
