### FEBRUARY 19, 2023

Dear Parish Family,

This weekend, we will be participating in the Bishop's Annual Stewardship Appeal. I am incredibly grateful for the generosity our parish showed last year, donating \$265,000 to the Appeal. Our participation last year consisted of 804 families. This year, the diocese has given us a goal of 891 families, and I am sure we can reach this goal. The dollar amount of your donation is not as important as participation as a parish.

This weekend's Gospel has many well-know teachings which present a pivotal transition from the Old Law, as recorded in the Old Testament, to the New Law, as promulgated by Christ. This New Law is one in which we look less for a strict sense of justice and more towards a deep sacrificial love. A love which accepts sufferings and wrongs, in hopes of bringing about the conversion of the aggressor. As we stand on the cusp of Lent, I encourage you to reflect upon the law which lives in your heart. Are you living within the bounds of an eye for an eye, or do you surrender the other check? The new law requires an incredible amount of inner peace and complete surrender to God's most Holy Will. The days of Lent, which begin this coming Wednesday, provide a remarkable opportunity to develop the inner peace and awareness of God's presence. I encourage you to join us for the Stations of the Cross each Friday during Lent at 7:00 p.m. in the Main Church. Confession will also be available at that time. Another great opportunity is to attend one daily Mass a week, or to commit to a weekly holy hour in the Cody Chapel. It is my hope, as a parish, that we will all dedicate ourselves to preparing for the great events of Holy Week.

I would like to express my gratitude toward the Brazilian Community for their donation of \$5,000 to the Capital Campaign! I am so grateful to all our parishioners and parish ministries who continue to help us reach our goal!

The 40-hour Adoration devotion has been a part of Catholic culture for over 500 years. It began in Milan in the early 1500's. By 1550, St. Philip Neri and St. Ignatius Loyola had also instituted this practice, especially for the reparation of sin. In the U.S., St. John Neumann, the fourth bishop of Philadelphia, was a strong promoter of the 40-hour Adoration devotion. He instituted it in 1853 to combat the violence against the Catholic community in his city.



This pre-Lent devotion is a great way to prepare your heart, and the heart of our parish community, for the 40 days of Lent.

# DIVINE MERCY CHAPLET

The Seven Secrets of Divine Mercy by Flynn & St. Faustina's Diary

The Chaplet is a prayer of our sincere offering to our loving Creator Father, joining us with Jesus in the offering of His Passion to the Father, in atonement for our sins...for our redemption. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy (so completely focused on the Passion of Christ) has become the prayer most often prayed at the three o'clock hour, the hour of Jesus' death. Jesus instructed St. Faustina to pray it "unceasingly" and to encourage others to pray it as well (Diary, 687, 1541). Also, our Lord said to St. Faustina: "... When souls say this chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as the Just Judge but as the Merciful Savior. ... if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy. I desire to grant unimaginable graces to those souls who trust in My mercy." (Diary #s 687, 1541, 1731) The Chaplet is said on ordinary rosary beads. The prayers said (besides the Sign of the Cross, Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be, and Apostles Creed) are:

**OPENING PRAYER** (optional): You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty yourself upon us (Diary, 1319).

O Blood and Water which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of Mercy for us, I trust in You! (three times) (Diary, 84).

**ON THE "OUR FATHER" BEAD** (before each decade): Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world (Diary, 476).

**ON THE "HAIL MARY" BEADS** (of each decade): For the sake of his sorrowful

Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world (Diary, 476).

**CONCLUDING DOXOLOGY** (after the five decades): Holy God, Holy Mighty one, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world (Three times) (Diary, 476).

**CONCLUDING PRAYER** (optional): Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence, submit ourselves to Your Holy Will which is Love and Mercy itself. Amen (Diary #950).

Praying the Chaplet (while meditating on Jesus' Passion) would be a wonderful enhancement to one's daily Lenten prayers.
