STEWARDSHIP MOMENT...

"The greatest among you will be the one who serves the rest," Jesus says in today's Gospel. What wonderful, good news for those who give of their time in service to others!

Did you Know? ¿Sabías qué?

We are moving now to the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy. The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy (SC) is a document of Vatican II signed by Pope Paul VI on December 4, 1963. As a Constitution, it is binding teaching for the whole Church.

"Matrimony is normally to be celebrated within the Mass, after the reading of the gospel and the homily, and before "the prayer of the faithful." The prayer for the bride, duly amended to remind both spouses of their equal obligation to remain faithful to each other, may be said in the mother tongue. But if the sacrament of matrimony is celebrated apart from Mass, the epistle and gospel from the nuptial Mass are to be read at the beginning of the rite, and the blessing should always be given to the spouses" (#78).

"El matrimonio normalmente se celebra dentro de la Misa, después de la lectura del evangelio y de la homilía, y antes de "la oración de los fieles". La oración por la novia, debidamente modificada para recordar a ambos cónyuges su iqual obligación de permanecer fieles el uno al otro, puede recitarse en la lengua materna. Pero si el sacramento del matrimonio se celebra fuera de la Misa, se leerán al comienzo del rito la epístola y el evangelio de la Misa nupcial, y la bendición se dará siempre a los cónyuges" (#78).

TO COME CLOSER TO JESUS



As members of St. Joseph Catholic Church, we are truly blessed because of its deep devotion

to Jesus Christ and the numerous ministries it has to offer. These ministries reach out to build Christian community, help the homeless, the poor, the elderly, and serve in so many other ways. I would like to share with you one of the ministries that is very dear to me: Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, also known as the EMHC Ministry.

Have you ever felt a desire to become closer to Christ? The EMHC may be the ministry God is calling you to get involved with. Serving as an EMHC means holding in your hands the Body and Blood of Christ, and in turn, serving the faithful. We request that our EMHC's strive to serve at the Main Church at least once a month, though some choose to serve more often to be closer to our Lord. Also, many EMHC's utilize opportunities to take Holy Communion to assisted living facilities, hospitals, or to those who are homebound in our community. Serving Holy Communion to the elderly, the sick, and the homebound is a humbling experience and a true gift, both for the one who receives and the one who gives. For those who are not able to come to Mass, this time with you and our Lord means the world to them.

If you feel Jesus is calling you toward this ministry, we require the following:

- 1. Pray to Jesus about it.
- 2. Be Catholic and in good standing with the Church. (For clarification on what it means to "be in good standing" please contact me and I will be happy to help.)
- 3. Send an email to Dcn. Kevin Boudreaux dcnkevin@ stjosephsjax.org and me sjemhc@stjosephsjax.org explaining why you feel Jesus has called you to serve as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion.
- 4. List all ministries on which you have served at St. Joseph's and other parishes.
- 5. Include any additional information you feel would be worthy of consideration.

St. Joseph will begin serving the Blood of Christ again beginning in September 2023. We need additional EMHCs to assist with serving Holy Communion, not only at the Sunday Masses, but also to the homebound, in nursing homes, and assisted living facilities. If you are already an EMHC and are not currently serving, we would love to have you back.
