# The Respect Life Ministry of ...

Recreated this ministry when the bishop initiated the Office of Human Life and Dignity, encouraging spiritual, educational, advocacy, and direct resource initiatives within each parish. Parish teams promote that every life is sacred, made in the image and likeness of God from conception to natural death. The following areas (Focuses) of Respect Life work covered by this office are included on this brochure.

### **Unborn/Abortion**

Due to the urgency of the threat against unborn life through abortion, our efforts pay special attention to the unborn focus. The national USCCB "Walking with Moms in Need" collects and provides resources for those pregnant and parenting. Educational programs such as spiritual adoption, and our diocesan pro-life educational program "Respecting Life Begins with Me" are available for every parish. Parishes are urged to join prayer vigils at abortion facilities and participate in events such as Adopt a Day and 40 DAYS FOR LIFE.

## **Healing After Abortion**

Since 1973 64 million abortions have occurred in our country. The aftermath of abortion can bring about excruciating emotional and spiritual pain, that many suffer in silence.

- Project Rachel Offers individual counseling and reconciliation with a licensed counselor and trained clergy.
- Rachel's Vineyard Retreat weekends bring healing through licensed counselors, clergy and volunteers who have suffered the same loss.

### **Special Needs**

Pre-natal diagnosis of special needs creates a very abortion vulnerable population. Unfortunately, medical counsel given in these instances often are to refer for abortion. Family support and education through Camp I Am Special, Morning Star School, L'Arche and ARC are encouraged, as well as support through Be Not Afraid Peer Ministry Pastoral Care.

# End of Life

The questions surrounding medical care, how to, and who should, care for lives incapacitated through accident or illness are increasingly a concern for individuals and families. How to create or comply with someone's wishes is the focus of a diocesan educational workshop called "A Question of Compassion" available to all parishes.

### Death Penalty/Prison Ministry

Following a consistent ethic of life principal, the Church has changed her stance on the death penalty. Due to available incarceration, the need for the death

penalty no longer exists to protect society. The diocese has an active prison ministry and is involved daily in cell front ministry to death row inmates. Following the international movement to end the death penalty the diocese hosts Cities for Life on November 30<sup>th</sup> every year. The need for Prison Ministers to assist in prisons is great. Parishes teams write letters and collect books for inmates.

## Human Trafficking

Exploitation of another human being for sexual, domestic, or work in agricultural settings is present day human slavery. As a parish we offer speakers and participation in diocesan offered workshops to educate our parish community, as well as networks with other agencies to advocate for victims.

### **Courage and Encourage**

This ministry offers monthly support groups for individuals experiencing same-sex attraction and for their families.

# **General Information**

Parishes are requested to hold a Holy Hour for Life or Rosary for Life weekly or monthly. Unplanned pregnancy and post-abortion healing assistance should be listed in all parish bulletins. The Office of Human Life & Dignity has a Speakers Bureau available to speak on all topics listed above.
