

Saint of the Week

On August 20th we celebrate the Memorial of Saint Bernard of Clairvaux (1090 – 1153). He was born near Dijon in France. After a religious upbringing, he joined the Cistercians in 1111 and later was chosen abbot of the monastery of Clairvaux. There he directed his companions in the practice of virtue by his own good example. Because of schisms which had arisen in the Church, he traveled all about Europe restoring peace and unity. He founded numerous monasteries and wrote many theological and spiritual works. St. Bernard was canonized by Pope Alexander III in 1174 and declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius VIII in 1830.


