### **Liturgical Bits & Bytes**

### **Amen**

This is our response of assent, approval, agreement. It is our statement that we believe and endorse all that has gone before. We call this the "great Amen," because, although there are many throughout the liturgy, this is the BIG ONE. This is our agreement, "so it is," to the wonderful prayer which we call the Eucharistic Prayer. Of all the parts of the Mass which are to be sung, this is the MOST important, because our response at this time is so important. It is our statement of faith and praise. It is our agreement to the whole action. Just as we offered our gifts, financial or otherwise, as a statement of our willingness to be part of this celebration and as a symbol of our willingness to be transformed with the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ, so our hearty and heartfelt "AMEN" vocally asserts this intention.

### **Communion Rite**

With the conclusion of the Eucharistic Prayer, we begin another part of the "Liturgy of the Eucharist" and that is the Communion Rite. So far we have experienced the taking of the bread (the Presentation of the Gifts) and the blessing of it (the Eucharistic Prayer). Now we prepare to break and share, but first we join together in the words that Jesus gave us.

The Our Father is a dangerous prayer. If we listen carefully to what we say, it truly challenges us. We pray for God's kingdom to come. Jesus personified the kingdom of God in his perfect obedience. This is a scary thing to pray for. We pray that God's will be done. If we say that honestly, we are letting go of our own will in favor of God's will. Jesus did this in the Garden of Gethsemene. Again, this is a scary thing to pray for. We need to give one another mutual support for this very challenging act of obedience.

## Saint of the Week

### **Saint James the Greater**

On July 25<sup>th</sup>, the Church celebrates the feast of St. James the Greater. The gospels record that James was one of the three closest disciples of Jesus, along with Peter and John. Called from his fishing nets along with his brother, John, James was present with Jesus at His transfiguration, His agony, and the raising of Jairus' daughter. After Christ rose, James became bishop of Jerusalem and was later martyred. Legend has it that St. James preached in Spain and after James's death, his disciples shipped his body to the Iberian Peninsula to be buried in what is now Santiago. Off the coast of Spain, a heavy storm hit the ship, and the body was lost to the ocean. After some time, however, it washed ashore undamaged, covered in scallops. It is his alleged tomb that is the destination of the famous Camino de Santiago.

### Pilgrimage to Tomb of Fr. Sebastian Rale

Seminarian Joe Moreshead will be leading a pilgrimage to the tomb of Fr. Sebastian Rale in Norridgewock on Sat., Aug. 5. Anyone interested should meet at St. Sebastian Church on 161 Main St. in Madison at 12:00NOON. The pilgrimage will end at approximately 3:00PM.

Fr. Rale was a Jesuit missionary in Maine in the early 1700s. For thirty years he cared for the souls of the Abenakis in a mission along the Kennebec until, caught in the cross fires of the French and Indian Wars, Fr. Rale was shot to death and his church burned to the ground by British troops. Come, take this opportunity to draw closer to Christ and delve into the inspiring story of one of the early missionaries of Maine.


