

St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, MSC also known as Mother Cabrini, was an Italian-American nun. In 1880 St. Frances Cabrini founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and went on to found 67 missionary institutions to serve the sick and poor in New York, Chicago Illinois, Seattle, New Orleans, Colorado, Los Angeles, Philadelphia and countries throughout Latin America and Europe. Today the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart have sisters serving throughout the world. St. Frances Xavier Cabrini died in 1917 at the age of 67. In 1946 she became the first US citizen to be canonized a Saint.

Sign-up to attend Masses at St. Mary's:

For the last few weeks we have been having on-line sign ups for the 5:30 pm Saturday vigil, 7:30 am and 10:00 am Sunday morning Masses for both the church and parish center. Moving forward due to numbers we are requiring those wishing to attend to sign up you will need to sign up each week for Mass. Sign ups will open on the Monday prior to the weekend and close at 5:00 pm on Thursday or when they are all full for the weekend.

If you do not have access to a computer please call the office (503)845-2296 to sign up for available spots.

Please call or email the office to sign up for 7 am daily Mass.

MASS GUIDELINES

- Please arrive at least 10-15 minutes prior to the start of Mass.
- Enter through the side door, closest to the street, and check-in with the greeter.
- **Masks are required.** Masks are available at the door.
- Use hand sanitizer as you enter the church.
- Sit only with the people in your group and use appropriate physical distancing.
- We ask that you accompany your children to the restroom.
- During the Communion procession please keep distance between your and other groups.
- We ask those wishing to receive on the tongue to wait until the end.
- You may exit through any of the doors to avoid bottle-necking after Mass.

Safe Environment – Grades 7-12 – November 18, 2020

In an effort to assist in the monumental mission of protecting children from abuse, St. Mary's is partnering with you to present a safe environment lesson to your youth within their youth program. It is our cherished role as adults to fully protect children. In addition, we must also teach children about their safety rights and boundaries, so that they have tools to protect themselves.

This school year, your child will be presented with a program entitled *Empowering God's Children*, in which Lesson Leaders present a safety lesson to children that houses a grade-appropriate video component along with a hands-on activity. The material is designed to better equip your child to know their rights, recognize their boundaries, and to empower them to protect themselves when safe adults are not immediately available—and ultimately be safer from people who might want to harm them. Youth will participate within one of the following lessons:

Lesson 1: *Physical Boundaries: Safe and Unsafe Touching Rules*

Lesson 2: *Safe Adults, Safe Touches and Special Safe Adults*

If you do NOT wish for your child to participate in this lesson, please contact youthministry@stmarymtangel.org or the Parish Office for an opt-out form. Due to the importance of this topic, we must provide opt-out forms to the Archdiocese of Portland for those who do not attend this lesson. Message from the Pastor...

COVID-19 has meant a huge “sea-change” for us since March (as well as during the days of the horrible wildfires with their destruction, smoke and ash. We have had to re-imagine religious education and youth ministry, chart a different course for ministry to the sick and homebound, deal with the very limited numbers for church which have gradually increased, perfected our livestreaming of daily and Sunday Masses, Weddings, Funerals, etc. over our YouTube channel. We have tried to keep all these going as an important service and link to the parishioners of St. Mary’s and beyond.

We cannot have our usual Benefit Dinner & Auction this year because of COVID restrictions. And so on Friday, November 13 we will come to you VIRUTUALLY —online— for help to balance our budget. We have a silent auction beginning Monday, November 9—13. One of the big blows to our budget was that we did not have our Oktoberfest booth this year. It typically brings in about \$50,000. In addition, our contributions / collections at Mass have been down, and so we have the goal of raising \$90,000 at this Virtual Benefit & Auction. Why do we need your help?.....



Our primary mission as a parish is to celebrate the Sacraments, especially the Eucharist, to make sure the church is open for prayer, to reach out to the sick and homebound and anyone who is suffering, and to provide opportunities to learn and grow in the faith.

All who were ready to receive First Reconciliation and First Communion, as well as those preparing for Confirmation received those Sacraments. We had extra Masses on Saturdays and Sundays to make it happen, but my staff and I made sure these children and youth received the Sacraments they prepared for. To the extent possible, and within the ever-changing restrictions, we have

also celebrated Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals, gone to hospitals and homes for the Anointing of the Sick, set up a special Confessional in the Church and kept the church open.

All this is to say that we are doing our best to provide the Sacraments, ministries, and religious formation our parish needs within all the limitations we have. But we need your help. Please be generous in your gifts to St. Mary Parish so that we can continue to serve you in the ways we are. Let us also raise our minds and hearts to God asking that he bring healing to our lives and world and bring an end to this Pandemic.
