I am so very grateful to our parish staff and volunteer leaders who have kept the parish running smoothly and prayerfully during my 'sabbath rest' time. It shows how visible the Holy Spirit IS in each and every baptized person!

I really look forward to celebrating my first weekend back with you on November 22-23, for the great feast of Christ the King.

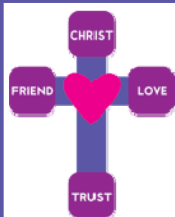
