The Meaning of Incense at Mass

Since we will be using incense during the Advent-Christmas season, I always like to give my annual brief overview of its importance in Scripture and our Catholic liturgy.

First, since some people cannot be around incense for health issues, we will not use it during the Saturday evening Mass and invite them to attend at that time. The use of incense is an expression of prayer, and it is, in fact, very scriptural. There is a recipe for incense in Exodus 30: 34-36, and in the following verses used for reverencing God. Also in Psalm 141 we pray, *"Let my prayer rise before you like incense, O Lord."*

During the Mass, as a sign of reverence, we incense both things and people. Burning of incense is a prayer in action. That action becomes ever more present through the visual and sensual experience of incense. Not only does the rising smoke symbolize the prayers of the faithful drifting up to heaven, burning incense is also meant to create the ambiance of heaven. The Book of Revelation describes heavenly worship as follows: *"The angel took his place at the altar...and the smoke of the incense went up before God and with it the prayers of God's people."* Hence, incense connects us to God's altar in heaven and allows us to utilize all of our senses in our prayer.

The use of incense adds a sense of solemnity and mystery to the Mass. The visual imagery of the smoke and the smell remind us of the transcendent aspect of the Mass, which links heaven with earth...as we enter into the Presence of God. Try to visualize your own prayers (and life) being raised to heaven when you see and pray with the incense rising!

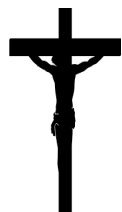

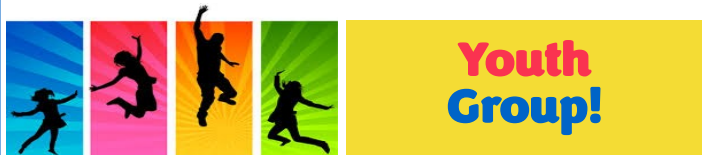

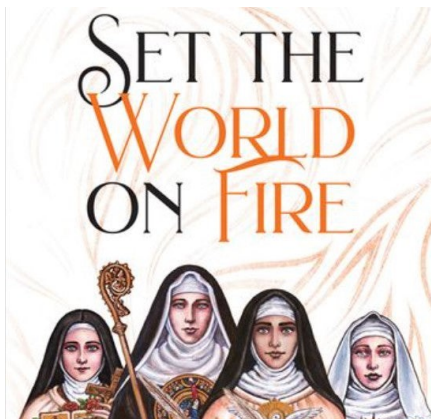
