





FIRST READING

1 Samuel 16:1b, 6-7, 10-13a

David is anointed as king of Israel.

The Lord said to Samuel: "Fill your horn with oil, and be on your way.

I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem,

for I have chosen my king from among his sons."

As Jesse and his sons came to the sacrifice,

Samuel looked at Eliab and thought,

"Surely the Lord's anointed is here before him."

But the Lord said to Samuel:

"Do not judge from his appearance or from his lofty stature,

because I have rejected him.

Not as man sees does God see, because man sees the appearance

the things done by them in secret;


but everything exposed by the light becomes visible,

The composer uses the expressive technique called "text painting" with the initial melody that ascends. The melody recurs with ever increasing texture and intensity, flowing with growing strength and confidence toward the words, My help cometh from the Lord.". The climax of the piece happens on the words "The Lord shall preserve thee from all evil."

I will lift up mine eyes unto the hills, from whence cometh my help. My help cometh from the Lord, who made heaven and earth.

# Invitation to Silent Prayer - Intercessions for the Elect - Rite of Exorcism - Dismissal of the Elect

The Scrutinies are rites for self-searching and repentance. The Scrutinies are meant to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the Elect; to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good. They are celebrated to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ. These rites, therefore, should complete the conversion of the elect and deepen their resolve to hold fast to Christ and to carry out their decision to love God above all.

(5:00, 8:30) NICENE CREED

I believe in one God,
the Father almighty,
maker of heaven and earth,
of all things visible and invisible.
I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ,
the Only Begotten Son of God,
born of the Father before all ages.
God from God, Light from Light,
