

CONFITEOR


I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do,

FIRST READING

Revelation 11:19a; 12:1-6a, 10ab


NICENE CREED

Inspired with this confidence, we fly to you, O Virgin of virgins, our mother; to you we come, before you we stand, sinful and sorrowful.


O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not our petitions, but in your mercy hear and answer me.






