



After their audience with the king they set out.


And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was.

AND BECAME MAN.


For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate.

To read in heav'n the Lord's command.


The guiding star above is bright; Within them shines a clearer light, And leads them on with power benign To seek the Giver of the sign.






