


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PENITENTIAL ACT: CONFITEOR

Liturgy of the Word

FIRST READING

1 Samuel 16:1b, 6-7, 10-13a

David is anointed as king of Israel.

The Lord said to Samuel: "Fill your horn with oil, and be on your way.

I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem,

for I have chosen my king from among his sons."

As Jesse and his sons came to the sacrifice,

Samuel looked at Eliab and thought, "Surely the Lord's anointed is here before him."

But the Lord said to Samuel: "Do not judge from his appearance

or from his lofty stature, because I have rejected him.

Not as man sees does God see, because man sees the appearance

but the Lord looks into the heart."

In the same way Jesse presented seven sons before Samuel, but Samuel said to Jesse,

"The Lord has not chosen any one of these."

Then Samuel asked Jesse, "Are these all the sons you have?"

Jesse replied, "There is still the youngest, who is tending the sheep."

The composer uses the expressive technique called "text painting" with an initial melody that ascends "to the hills." The melody recurs with ever increasing texture and intensity, flowing with growing strength and confidence toward the words, "My help cometh from the Lord." This text from Psalm 121 is especially appropriate given that this Sunday's readings lead us to reflect on our "spiritual vision."

I will lift up mine eyes unto the hills, from whence cometh my help.

He will not suffer thy foot to be moved:

he that keepeth thee will not slumber.

Behold, he that keepeth Israel shall neither slumber nor sleep.






