

Our Friends in Heaven, Pray for Us: Saint Josephine Margaret Bakhita was born in 1869 in a region of Sudan. Her family were members of the Daju tribe where her uncle was the tribal chief. She said that while growing up, she did not know suffering. When she was about nine years old, she was kidnapped by Arab slave traders. Even though she was just a child, she was forced to walk barefoot 600 miles to a slave market. She was bought and sold twice during this journey. Over the next 12 years, she was bought and sold at least a dozen times and she even forgot her given name. Her treatment varied while a slave from fair to cruel. In 1883, she was sold to the Italian Vice Consul, Callisto Legani who was kinder to her than other owners. She was given as a gift to another family who had her as their nanny, While hey traveled, they placed her in custody of the Canossian Sister in Venice where she learned more about God. The family returned and wanted her back and she refused which caused this to go to court. It was discovered that slavery was outlawed before she was born and she was now free. She stayed with the sister and took final vows in December 1896. She is the patron saint of Sudan and her feast day is February 8.

## A Word From Fr. Tom Niehaus



#### **Perfect Love**

Sweethearts, lovers, all you givers of chocolate and wine this is the time of year where one can pour out your heart's appreciation for that person you love so dearly. Valentine's Day week is always a special time to express the love of your heart to another. As children we demonstrate this love of the other through the innocent exchange of heart candy and paper valentine cards with heart decorations on them. As we mature in our love we express our love for other members of our families by saying, "I love you." Couples who are dating or are married express their love for each other as well through daily sharing of loving words and kind deeds. Jesus expresses the way of His love as this, "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for their friends (John 15:13)." This greater love is modeled by Jesus for all people whether we are a child, part of a family, dating, married or in another walk of life. In this week's Gospel we see the love of Jesus demonstrated in His care for the leper. Jesus is not repulsed by the sight of the leper, but rather treats him with love and honors his dignity as a child of God. The leper begs Jesus to make him clean and Jesus responds with compassion, extending His hand, touching the man and completely healing the disease of leprosy saying, "I do will it. Be made clean (Mark 1:41)." Jesus is the lover of our souls and He has great care for all of us. As you see many hearts adorning the windows of homes and chocolate shops, remember that it is Jesus the lover of lovers who has offered His Sacred Heart as a pledge of His love for all!

#### Lent 2024

"Let us fix our attention on the blood of Christ and recognize how precious it is to God His Father, since it was shed for our salvation and brought the grace of repentance to all the world (St. Clement)." We begin this special forty-day journey with Jesus to Jerusalem on Ash Wednesday and spiritually unite ourselves in the Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving with Jesus until Holy Saturday. This year I encourage you to choose one person per week to be the person that you hold up in prayer in a special way as you sacrifice with Jesus during the Lenten disciplines. We can savor the fruits of our Lord's cross when individually and/or as a community we participate in Confession, the Stations of the Cross, praying the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary, praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet, making time for silent prayer, fasting, almsgiving, denying ourselves from sweets or alcohol, attending daily Mass, carrying a blessed Cross around with you and at times during the day holding it as a reminder of our Lord's great love and taking on other sacrifices as directed by our Lord, pastor or spiritual director. It can be fruitful as a parish community to participate in a unified communal Lenten observance. As you will experience at Mass during Lent: purple is worn, the music slows down, the Alleluia is not sung, lively tunes are not played and the prayers convey a somber tone as we are reminded of keeping our penitential disposition during this sacred season. This year for Lent I have felt the Lord asking me to have the community kneel together and pray in silence at the end of Mass rather than sing a closing song. How is Jesus inviting you to journey with Him on this 40-day pilgrimage of love?

#### Ash Wednesday 2024


All are invited to attend Ash Wednesday Mass on February 14, 2024. Masses this year in our area parish cluster will be held at Most Holy Redeemer at 8:30 am and at 6:30 pm as well as at St. Patrick's at 6:30 pm (livestreamed on St. Patrick's YouTube channel). As one is marked with ashes the phrases, "Repent and believe in the Gospel," or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return," are spoken. Begin the season of Lent by taking time to attend Mass in one of our area churches. Take time out of your busy schedule to start the season of Lent right with Jesus Christ!

#### **Church Teaching on Fasting and Abstinence**

Lent is a season of fast and abstinence. The Catholic Church teaches that 1). abstinence from meat (beast or bird) is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen years old and older on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all other Fridays of Lent. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products, or condiments of any kind, even though made of animal fat. 2). Fasting means limiting oneself to one full meal on a given fast day. Catholics who are eighteen to fifty-nine years old are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On fast days, two additional smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength. However, the two smaller meals together may not equal one full meal. Moreover, eating solid foods between meals on fast days is not permitted. These disciplines are part of our Lenten lifestyle as Catholics, to help us be united with Christ and with each other as we remember in a small way the great sacrifice He undertook for our salvation.


