Dear God's Family,

A Blessed Pentecost Sunday to All of You!

It is impossible to see the wind. What we see is the movement of things it blows, such as trees or flags, as well as the feeling of its movement on our skin. It is equally impossible to see the movement of the Holy Spirit. But we can sense that movement by its effect on those through whom the Holy Spirit is flowing.

Interestingly, St. Luke describes the movement of the Holy Spirit on that first Pentecost. He writes that "tongues as of fire appeared on each of the Twelve (Acts of the Apostles). Then he writes that the Holy Spirit enabled them to proclaim God's mighty acts in different languages. All of Jerusalem sensed something extraordinary, for they realized that no matter their language, they could understand the apostles' message.

Through the centuries up to our time, we can see the movement of the Holy Spirit no more than we can see the wind, but we can perceive it through the ways the Holy Spirit acts in us, with us and through us. That is how our faith and the church has survived through the centuries, thanks to the Holy Spirit!

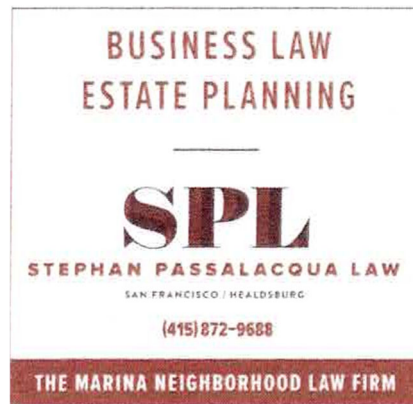

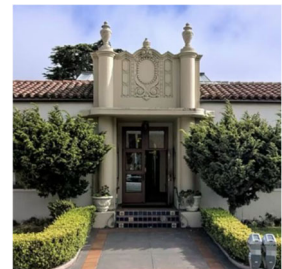
