

Reflections on World Mission Sunday: The Evangelization of Peoples 2020

The Twenty-Ninth Sunday, Year A, October 18, 2020. Our Bible Readings are Is. 45:1, 4-6; 1 Thess. 1:1-5b; Mt. 22:15-21; and Song of Praise Ps. 96. This weekend is World Mission Sunday. The Church is called and sent to the world, to evangelize all peoples and cultures of the world, that they may know Christ and his mission on earth, and that they may join to worship God in the Eucharistic Festival, and be made fit for worship in the kingdom of our God and King of the universe, (cf. SC 10). In theology we learn of three missions, or three processions, namely, missions of Christ, the Spirit, and the Church. Christ has Threefold Mission as Priest, Prophet and King. In commissioning the Church, the Lord said: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." (Mt. 28:19-20). For this reason, all who are baptized into Christ Jesus are called and sent on mission. As Christians we have become sons and daughters by adoption into the eternal Son of God and share in the Threefold Mission of Christ. These have their implications even as we reflect on the Mission of the Church. Blessed are you if you understand this singular privilege and call.

Our Archbishop, Daniel Cardinal DiNardo, in writing to us for this occasion said, "Pope Francis has frequently reminded us that as baptized Catholics we are called to bring Christ's love to our brothers and sisters around the world who have yet to hear the Gospel and to participate in the sacramental life of the Church. The Holy Father asks us to respond on World Mission Sunday through prayer and generous sacrifice to support the work of the Society for Propagation of the Faith, encouraging one another to answer, "Here I am, Send Me." (Letter October 1, 2020). The Pope is the Chief Missioner. We are his co-workers, while he is our Commander-in-Chief in the Vineyard of the Lord.

In our First Reading from Is. 45:1, 4-6, King Cyrus, a pagan king conquered Babylon and set the Israelites free to return to their home country from exile in Babylon, free to worship their God according to their religion. Isaiah called him the Lord's anointed, and ultimately it must be the Lord's doing. Who else would have prompted king Cyrus to also "Let my people go"! (Ex. 5:1).

A reminiscence of liberation from slavery in Egypt! In the Second Reading, St. Paul and his fellow missionaries, brought the gospel of Christ to Thessalonica, as he said, through the Holy Spirit, (cf. 1 Thess. 1:1-5b). The Church of today is sending missionaries out to all the nations of the world, to shine like lights. That is how you and I received the faith and got baptized through the Mission of the Church. In acclamation we sing "Alleluia, Alleluia, Shine like lights in the world, as you hold on to the word of life." (Phil. 2:15-16).

In the Gospel, in order to entrap the Lord Jesus, they asked if they should still pay allegiance to Caesar by paying tax. The coin, Jesus answered them, has the image of Caesar. Therefore, it belongs to Caesar. We are made in the image and likeness of God. Therefore, we belong to God and must give ourselves completely to God in total surrender. As Christians we are both citizens of our countries as well as citizens of heaven. We all have dual citizenship. We belong to the world and we also belong to heaven. Some religious sects indoctrinate their followers and deprive them of participating in their civic rights to make the world a better place. As citizens we will join in civic elections to vote and pay tax. We are not to allow ourselves to be persecuted always by those who do not want our religion to prosper. While we pray for religious freedom, it may not come easy unless we join to work in government. Convinced Christians bring about good and Christian environment, justice, peace, freedom, respect for human dignity and happiness for all. Do not be an observer, instead be a participant. Until all areas of life are Christianized for Christ, we cannot stop our missionary activities for the liberation of the whole person and of all peoples. Whom shall I send? "Here I am Lord, send me!"

Why did I become a missionary priest myself? In those days when I was growing in my interest to become a priest, after receiving First Holy Communion and Confirmation in my teenage years, I reflected it was because foreign missionaries gave themselves selflessly for mission that I got the opportunity and received baptism. In the same way I would leave my homeland and join in the spread of the Good News. "And how can they hear without someone to preach? And how can people preach unless they are sent? ... How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news! ... Thus, faith comes from what is heard, ..." (Rom. 10:14-18). You too have a choice to make on this. There are various ways of becoming or remaining on mission. Take a definite stand in what you are doing for Christ based on your situation in life: as a lay faithful, a religious, a clergy, etc. We call it vocation. We are the Church. Whom shall I send? "Here I am Lord, send me!"
