

FROM FR. CHRIS ALIMAJI'S DESK Reflections on the Christian Marriage Bond

Our Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B, readings are from Genesis 2:18-24, Hebrews 2:9-11, Mark 10:2-16, and Psalm 128. Every weekend, the body of Christ, the Church, gather together to celebrate the Eucharist. We do so because as Heb. 2:9-11 says, through or in baptism we are consecrated in the Lord. With that we have become brothers and sisters in Christ. What dos consecration in the Lord mean to you, one may ask? Does it not mean you are made sacred, which means holy, to the Lord?

In the second creation story (Gen 2), the Lord God took the initiative that: "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a suitable partner for him." (Ibid. 18). The creatures on earth other than humans are and cannot become equal partners with humans. God brought them to the man "to see what he would call them." Name giving culturally is a sign of ownership. Humans gave names to animals and possessed them. When Adam could find no suitable partner among animals and birds, God brought Eve to him. He was over-joyed and exclaimed: "This one, at last, is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh." He called her 'woman.' The power and sacredness of naming our own is expressed right there. Naming is also a bond of ownership. We name our own. Parents and families give names to their children, according to their cultures. Among the Jewish people, and some other cultures like mine, the Ibos of Nigeria, name-giving is celebrated on the eighth day after birth, (cf, Lk 2:21). In the first marriage on earth, the husband and wife became one flesh. Therefore, in marriage, husband and wife become one flesh. This is the meaning of marriage. All who are married must understand what they entered into - a union of oneness. Let their marriage prayer always be: "May the Lord bless us all the days of our lives." (cf. Ps 128:5), so that they may share in the happy home of the just.

The Gospel acclamation says: "If we love one another. God remains in us and his love is brought to perfection in us." The Lord Jesus was questioned in today's Gospel regarding the marriage bond - a question in contradiction. "Is it lawful for a husband to divorce his wife?" I could have entitled my Reflections 'divorce' but it is more than that, hence I entitled it 'The Christian Marriage Bond'. From creation man and woman in the bond of marriage became one flesh. How does a person separate himself or herself from oneself? Such is the question of divorce. Read the response the Lord Jesus gave. Moses, like the lawmakers of our nations, gave us marriage laws. God and Moses who is supreme? The Lord turned them back to God

while quoting Gen 2:24. Concluding, the Lord declared: "So they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, no human being must separate." (Mk 10:8b-9). We can add that the word MUST is emphatic, because we are interfering with God's law in our human law. God and man are not equals. The outcome of our interference is adultery.

What is divorce? Divorce is the tearing apart of the marriage bond made by God. Who tears it apart? We, the humans, tear marriage apart. What is Jesus' teaching? "They are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, no human being must separate." (ibid.). Those who tear valid marriages apart are not Christians. But we contract or hand over our Christian marriages to them (pagans) to tear off our flesh from us. God's law and human law, which one is supreme law? We see for ourselves the consequences of our actions in our world.

How important is your priest?


