



FROM FR. CHRIS ALIMAJI'S DESK Reflections on the Wedding Banquet:

Last week we reflected on the Baptism of the Lord, after which he launched into his public ministry. Beginning the Ordinary Season our reflection today is centered on the Lord carrying out a ministry of the miracle of changing water into wine (cf. John 2:1-1). One could say Mary helped to awaken earthly and eternal ministry in Jesus and he realized truly that his hour had begun. This hour would be completed on Calvary. The people had abundant supply for a joyful wedding feast, to the surprise of everyone. It was testified that this was his first miracle, launching him into public spectacle. Was it meant to tell us that God provides for his people even when they are not fully aware or ask? The details of how it happened are already recorded in Scripture. Let us put them together and decipher what it all means.

St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians was about the unity and variety of our spiritual gifts (cf. 1 Cor. 12:4-11). Eternal gifts are for the common good, and they build up the community. Like Mary, we also help and encourage each other in putting our gifts and talents to service. Even the earth's resources, example gas, gold, diamond is not left for individuals alone, but for the common good- the common wealth of the nations. The government does legislate common goods to benefit everyone. The Church also does legislate on how to use our spiritual gifts to benefit others. The individual may not apply them as one pleases. We can help to bring out the good in one another. When we all bring out what the Lord has blessed us with, we discover that the earth is filled with the goodness of the Lord; and that there is great abundance of resources among us. God has blessed us with abundance and no single person can exhaust them

They are enough for the human family, the Church, and all the earth.

The context of the wedding is the occasion of the Lord's first miracle. It was a context of feasting, festival, celebration, abundance, an image of our marriage with our God. It was a foretaste of the heavenly wedding banquet which the Lord sets before us, in which our cups would overflow (cf. Ps. We are all invited to the eternal wedding banguet in heaven. Jesus used this image of a weddings feast several times in the course of his teaching. One good example was the merchant that called a wedding feast for his son and people were bought in from the cross-roads and byways. We must all be prepared to attend the foretaste of the wedding banquet every Sunday at least. At the wedding banquet, the Lord provide juicy wine in abundance, to which everyone would be satisfied.




The gift of Advent
