

FROM FR. CHRIS ALIMAJI'S DESK Reflections on Marriage Engagement of the Holy Family

Fourth Sunday of Advent, Year A, 2022. Our Bible Readings are from Isaiah 7:10-14; Romans 1:1-7; Matthew 1:18-24, and Ps. 24. This is the last Sunday of Advent, and it is within the Christmas Novena week. Let us reflect on the spirit of Christmas in comparison to what our world of today celebrates as Christmas, or holidays, with all its hustling and bustling.

The Jewish religion, Judaism, has many things in common with our religion, Christianity. These two religions believe in dreams and visions, and in angels, and in miracles, and in God as a loving and merciful Creator. God has compassion on his creatures who put their faith in Him. As Christians, we believe also that the Lord is the King of glory. We want and hope to share in the glory of the Lord, in his kingdom. His kingdom is open to our departed brothers and sisters.

St. Paul greets us today through his epistle to the Romans, trusting in the "resurrection from the dead," through Jesus Christ our Lord. Let us sanctify ourselves with his prayer: "Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ." (Rom. 1:7). St. Paul has given you and me, all of us, the assurance of faith for life eternal. For this reason, we pray for our dead with faith in the resurrection and life everlasting. Coming out of the month of November, when we prayed earnestly for our departed loved ones, we trust in the merciful judgment of the King of glory which the coming Emmanuel brings to us. Joseph, a descendant of King David, got engaged in marriage to Mary, a virgin daughter of God, unknown to him of God's plan for human salvation through her offspring, (cf. Gen. 3:15).

Let us read again the message of the angel of the Lord to Joseph in a dream: "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the......

Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son and you are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." (Matt. 1:20-21). You will name him JESUS; why? "Because he will save his people from their sins." (ibid.). The prophet Isaiah (cf. Is. 7:14), prophesied about Emmanuel, a name which St. Matthew tells us today the meaning: "God is with us." (Matt. 1:23). This child is to be born by "the virgin", not just 'a virgin'. The definite article here means the designated virgin, designated by God by his own authority. In doing so God has fulfilled his promise, as we read at Solemnity of the Immaculate the Conception, regarding the woman whose child would strike the serpent's head, (cf. Gen. 3:15). Joseph, the righteous man, did as the angel had commanded him to do in his dream. What do you contemplate of regarding the Blessed Virgin Mary, the New Eve? Is she a mystery woman?

Have you ever received message in a dream? What did you do with it? Take some time today and this week, to reflect on your own dreams and on this Wonder Child. If you are desiring to get married, what form of prayers do you say? Or, do you pray at all for your plan and role in marriage? Do you plan to have a holy family of your own, in imitation of Joseph and Mary? If you have a difficult marriage and are contemplating divorce, have you tried to seek God's will in your marriage? Pray for your marriage, for "the family that stays together, stays together." Let the unmarried also pray for those in marriage.




