



FROM FR. CHRIS ALIMAJI'S DESK Reflections on Corpus Christi: The Body and Blood of Christ

On this June 11, 2023, following the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, we celebrate the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, the sacrifice of Bread and Wine. Eucharistia which means "Thanksgiving" makes the Mass a Thanksgiving feast in the Body and Blood of Christ. Every time we celebrate Mass, we re-enact the Last Supper and the death of Christ on the cross. Christ offered himself willingly to the Father for us all. Therefore, the Mass is a thanksgiving celebration "through him, with him, and in him". It was called Corpus Christi: Latin for "The Body of Christ". In the Eucharist we commune with God and one another, hence it is called Holy Communion, (cf. John 6:56).

We believe that through the transubstantiation that takes place at Mass during the Consecration, the bread and wine truly become the Body and Blood of Christ. When anyone receives either the Sacred Body or the Precious Blood, it is the Lord that is received in any of the sacred species. We receive the Eucharist gracefully, after duly preparing through the Sacrament of Reconciliation to purify ourselves of known sins, thus reconciling with God and our neighbors. Confession is a necessary requirement that we should observe in conscience. The Eucharist is a meal of love, joy and peace, and for growth in holiness, given to us at tablefellowship. Today we emphasize the Holy Eucharist as spiritual food for the spiritual nourishment of members of God's family. The Lord promised to raise on the last day all that eat his Body and drink his Blood (cf. John 6:54). Our forefathers in the faith ate manna in the desert, (cf. Deut. 8:3, 14-16). Let us understand that manna in the desert as prefiguring the nourishment we receive from the Eucharist. The Passover lambs slain in Egypt and the rock from which water flowed that quenched their thirst also prefigure Christ. In our first Reading today, Moses reminded the Israelites that God cares and provides for his people. He offered them food for the journey during their forty years in the desert, just as he provides for us now as we journey in our deserts of today's world.

The Lord Jesus Christ at the Last Supper changed bread and wine into his Body and Blood (cf. 1 Cor. 10:16-17; 11:23-26; Lk. 22:19-20; Mt. 26:26-28 & Mk. 14:22-24). In John's Gospel today, Christ refers to himself as the "living bread" that gives eternal life, (cf. John 6:51-58). The Last Supper is the enactment of the New Covenant in the Body and Blood of the Lord, for the forgiveness of sins. (cf. Jer. 31:31-34). This is no longer bulls' blood or goats' blood (cf. Heb.9:11-15) which are incapable of washing away sins, but the divine blood of Christ himself. Here the Lord feeds us with spiritual food, a foretaste of the feast in the kingdom of heaven. The Lord has spread his table before us and satisfies our hunger (cf. Ps. 23). This is our feast and our celebration. Following this feast is the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus feast this Friday for our devotion and adoration of the Most Holy Eucharist. Be present if you can!




