FROM FR. CHRIS ALIMAJI'S DESK Reflections on Using our Talents in Preparation for the Lord's Return

The Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A

Proverbs 31:10-13,19-20, 30-31; Psalm 128; 1 Thessalonians 5:1-6; Matthew 25:14-30

The Parable of the Talents exposes us to numerous realities in life. How we utilize our gifts depends on us individually. Last week's Parable of the Ten Virgins focused on readiness, but nonetheless touched on the significance of virginity for the sake of the kingdom without saying it. It indicates that virginity has something to do with salvation. Both last week's parable and today's parable indicate the necessity to be prepared and ready for the last day, the Day of the Lord. These are final reflections on the end time. We need to get that clear. They are indicative of the Last Day. Next weekend, the 34th Sunday in Ordinary Time, reflects the Last Day, the Judgment Day, the Solemnity of Christ the King of the Universe. These Scripture passages are wake up calls for anyone who has been sleeping, not taking seriously the services of the Kingdom.

In the Book of Proverbs, we read of works for the kingdom of joy and peace. The man who finds a worthy wife has joy and peace all his days. She brings good not evil, and altogether enriches herself and becomes generous and kind. "Give her a reward for her labors, and let her works praise her at the city gates." (Prov. 31:31). What a contentment for living well! When the psalm says that "Blessed are those who fear the Lord," we must also add, "who walk in his ways." (Ps. 128). They shall eat the fruit of their handiwork, great reward for the good man and woman. Some people may fear the Lord but do not walk in his ways. In our lives on earth, God has given us talents, otherwise gifts, spiritual gifts as well as human abilities to work for him here on earth. How easily we go after things and matters that distract us, swaying us from achieving the goals God in creation set for every living soul that he created. How sad the possessions given to us become the causes of failure for many of us. St. Paul also addresses humanity in figures of speech, proverbial address to us Christians. He touches times and seasons, and writes about night or darkness. But he says: "let us stay alert and sober." (1 Thess. 5:6). Be prepared is what he says. God entrusted his possessions to you as good and faithful servant. How have you used them?

As we read these prior to the last day of days, how do you look at yourself, my reader, through them? I believe they are meant to be food for thought for every one of us, every believing soul. Do not read them just as stories. Rather, how do others benefit from your gifts and talents? When others are doing something "beautiful for God" as Mother Theresa said, what are you doing for your soul's salvation? The talents are given, "to each according to his ability." (Mt. 25:15). Do not tell us you have no ability, when you just sit in church but do nothing after hearing the Good News. How are you walking your way into the kingdom of God? How diligent are you in religious matters? Are you being crookedly smart, engaging yourself in nothing? It is not about the quantity you received, but what you are doing with it. God wants to receive interest from you. Then he can say to you: "Well done, my good and faithful servant. ... Come, share your master's joy." (Mt. 25:23). This month's tradition of praying for our departed loved ones, is a reminder that we shall one day pass away from this world. May God prepare us for his coming in glory! Amen.




