



FROM FR. CHRIS ALIMAJI'S DESK Reflections on Christ the King of the Universe 2023

Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17; Psalm 23; 1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28; Matthew 25:31-46.

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

Last weekend I referenced the seven Wisdom Literatures that include Proverbs and Wisdom we read much from this month of November. In Wisdom 7:22b-8:1 is Wisdom personified. Figuratively, Jesus the Christ is the Wisdom of God, with his name given to us before he was born. The Book of Revelation has so much on the last days. May I encourage the reading of its twentytwo chapters this November, to give ourselves a deep reflection for the final days on earth.

The Solemnity of Christ the King of the Universe, is the final feast of Christendom, the culmination of all our teachings and all our celebrations. This celebration, figuratively, is the end of the world. By this celebration, Christianity is presenting the Judgment Day to the whole world. We are teaching that Jesus the Lord, is the Christ, and that he is the King of Kings and the Lord of Lords. We are teaching and revealing to the whole of creation that Jesus our Lord is the Judge of the human race. How excellent for our religion! He rules in the spiritual and heavenly realm and unlike the earthly kings, his kingdom will have no end. He secured the world for himself and conquered in the spiritual warfare, and would hand over the world, all creation, to his Father, (cf. 1 Cor. 15:24, 28). Hence, when Pontus Pilate interrogated Jesus about his kingship: "Then you are a king?" His answer was positive and definitive. "You say I am a king. For this I was born and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice." (Jn. 18:33-37). The plan of God achieved by the Christ is for all the human race. Therefore, Peter admonished, "There is no salvation through anyone else, " (Acts 4:12).

It does not matter anyone's religion or creed. Christ is the Savior of all humankind. This is our Christian teaching to all of humanity. Our prophetic witnessing is to make him known because we have known him for who he is. For this reason, I too, became his prophet. One of the thieves crucified with him also bore witness when he said: "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." Jesus rose from death, our last enemy, to take his honor as the conqueror of sin and death, (1 Cor. 15:26).

In Matthew's gospel, chapter 25:31-46, which is a continuation form last week's gospel on the Last Judgment, the Lord carefully enumerated for us, the terms for our judgment when he comes in glory on the last day. He will separate the good people from the bad people, like sheep is separated from goats. There will be disguising that any one would mix up with those not from one's group when the selection is made. It is our good deeds that would be credited to us. The Church teaches them to us as corporal works of mercy and spiritual works of mercy. They are the love and care we show to those in need, the homeless, the stranger, the hungry, and all. In brief, our good deeds, because we who believe in Christ will be rewarded on Judgment Day. Christ, Son of the living God, have mercy on us.




