
Outreach Committee Easter Basket Drive



Pastor's Corner

What We Believe

Dear Beloved Parishioners,

On this Palm Sunday, we enter the holiest week of our faith, Holy Week. In the ugliness of Jesus' Passion is the beauty and richness of our faith. Today we recall Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. In Jerusalem, the last acts of Jesus are done. He will suffer greatly. With his hands tied, Jesus will be scourged at the pillar, have a crown of thorns crushed into his head, be spat on and mocked and ridiculed by the crowd. It is only natural to look away. It is too shocking to look at Jesus. We cannot accept what we see.

To look away, though, is to look away from love. The essence and truth of love is to willingly and freely suffer for others. To see the battered and bruised Jesus is to not only witness immense and incredible love, but to experience it in all its wonder. Ultimately, Jesus will die an agonizing death, death on a cross. His death is not done in vain. The Passion of Jesus is all about his unconditional and inexhaustible love for us.

The evangelist John proclaims God is love. God' love for us is made real in the person of his son Jesus Christ. To believe that we are not loved is to not believe in God and Jesus. If you should ever doubt, question or not believe that you are not loved unconditionally, then look not away from the crucifix, but look at it intensely and believe in your heart. We are loved. Live in God's love and express it in how you live your life.

"Breaking Good"

The word "homily" is derived from the Greek and it means to have a verbal communication. In Acts (24:26) and in I Corinthians (15:33) the homily is mentioned and Origen describes the homily as commentary, without formal introduction, based on some part of the Sacred Scripture. It is the oldest form of Christian preaching.

When the Sacred Scriptures are proclaimed in Church, our caring God is speaking to us. To facilitate a greater understanding of what God is saying to us in our own lives and circumstances, the celebrant seeks to "break open the Word," making it relevant to the Assembly. This requires careful attention to the message of the Scriptures and the present needs of the listeners. Preparing a meaningful homily requires meditation, prayer, timing, and delivery. When he hits the mark, the homilist truly makes the Word present, showing how our loving God is acting in our lives today and in union with the Eucharist to nurture us in grace. Dede Waters-Masters
