

Pastor's Corner

ers, Trinitarian Thoughts

Dear Beloved Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. As you may know, the Holy Trinity is defined as one nature, three persons: God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. On a theological level, this is how we explain the Most Holy Trinity. Yet, I understand it beyond that.

There were times in my life when I was fatherless. As an adopted child from South Korea, I will never know anything about my biological father. It is just not possible. My adopted father died about a year after I arrived to America. As human beings, we are meant to have a father. We are meant to be in a relationship. That is how we are made. Sometimes in life, though, it does not work out that way. As a wee lad, it never really bothered me that I did not have a father. Even at an early age, I think deep down I knew instinctively I had something to hang onto. I may not have had a father at times, but I always had my faith. Faith instilled in me the belief that I was never abandoned or alone in life.

Faith reminded me that I am loved beyond all telling by God our Father. Jesus taught us to call God our Father, and so He is. I was reminded of that every time I made the sign of the cross as a child. God is my Father and God is your Father. He is ours, and we are His. We belong to him. Through Jesus the Son, we are drawn and gathered into the divine life of the Most Holy Trinity. To me, that divine life is love. All along, especially in the difficulty times of my life, I was loved by a father, by Our Father. His Spirit of love infused my heart before I was ever born.

As a catechist for 40 years, I have given a lot of simplistic explanations of the Trinity which would probably make some theologians cringe. It's hard to explain a mystery. Today I think of the Trinity as the "different faces of God, one in being ,yet distinct as images of the divine." This divine oneness of three persons is the sacred relationship perpetually joined together in love. It is out of this eternal love that all creation occurs.

What We Believe

If we accept that we are created in the image and likeness of God then we have to realize that we are truly the products of God's love, and love cannot thrive unless this love is shared. Being in loving relationships with one another defines who we are when we are being our best selves, the selves meant to be in the image and likeness of God.

As Catholics we begin and end our prayers with the Sign of the Cross. This trinitarian prayer identifies the communal aspect of God reminding us that we are inheritors of the eternal, loving relationship of God.


