

Dear Beloved Parishioners,

During basic training for the military, it was drilled in us to be squared away. To be squared away means to have everything in order, to be ready always because at a moments notice one could be shipped off to go to war. That is how the military personnel are suppose to live their lives each and every day. In a real sense, that is how we, who believe in Jesus, are suppose to live our lives as well.

In today's gospel passage, Jesus urges his disciples to be vigilant, to be ready always because we do not know when the end of the world will come. More specifically, we do not know when we will die. It could be years from now. It could be next year. It could be even by the time you finish reading this letter. Being squared away will enable us to meet Jesus face to face with a clear conscious and with a pure heart.

Each new day gives us the opportunity to live a life of faith. Faith in Jesus compels us to love God and to love our neighbor as ourselves, and to be of service to those in need. This is what Jesus desires us to do. This is what life is really about. This is what makes our lives meaningful, and this is what enriches our lives. In the words of my Marine Corps drill instructor Staff Sergeant Sears, "Be squared away."

## **Storing Up**

Amid the flooding of recent months I heard a saying that also fits this Sunday's parable, "Fix the roof while the sun is shining." The five prudent virgins were prepared to receive the delayed bridegroom and were rewarded for their preparedness by going to the bridegroom's party. They had the right mindset for their journey. They stored up.

Living in today's world and its recent continuous, catastrophic surprises, it's difficult to know just how to prepare for *anything*. Stock-piling food, putting on storm windows, making sure the gas tank and your wallet are full, and looking over your shoulder are sound measures, but Jesus' parable really goes deeper. So how do we prepare for the dark times we inevitably encounter? How do we fill our oil lamps so as to see our way through them?

As we approach the holiday season, it might be a good time to reexamine our innermost beliefs and values, the "cupboards" of our hearts and souls, because it is those "supplies" that really get us through the rough patches. It may be comforting to remember that God thought enough of us to willingly enter into the human condition, and not as one of the "haves." Entering this world as a temporarily "homeless" infant, placed in an animal feeding trough, and whose birth was witnessed by the lowest rung of society, shepherds, is a story of the marginalized, the story of Emmanuel, the "God with us" who exists in the saddest of situations, then and now.

While we reaffirm our sincere gratitude to our gracious God for all our blessings, we can't really do that completely without simultaneously acknowledging and seeking to help those who experience painful loss, ill health, or untimely death. It is our prayers, our empathy, and our assistance in this world that serves as our own store of oil, allowing us to see the light.
