God's Time Line

In John 11, it is important to note that Mary and Martha's messenger made a two day journey from Bethany to Perea. Upon hearing of Lazarus' illness, Jesus stayed in Perea another two days, saying, "The sickness is not unto death but for the glory of God, that the son of God may be glorified through it." Why does Jesus say this?

Surprisingly Jesus stays on in Perea two more days and makes his two-day journey to Bethany. Why did Jesus delay in coming to his beloved friends' aid? Mary and Martha believed in Jesus' ability to raise the dead but in the case of Jairus' daughter and the widow of Nani's son, Jesus, being present, raised them in their first day of death, so the sisters' sense of urgency is understandable.

To understand Jesus' reason for delaying his return it is important to note the popular Hebrew view of death. It was believed that upon death, a deceased person's "nefesh," his soul, hovered over his body for three days. Because the body would fall into rapid decay by the fourth day, the "nefesh" would depart and the finality of death began. Fearful that Jesus was the Messiah, the Jewish establishment sought to explain away Jesus' raising miracles as coma recoveries. But Jesus' late arrival to Bethany and his raising of Lazarus after four days could not be explained away. There could be no denying of Jesus being the Messiah, and the raising of Lazarus is the signal to the Jewish establishment that their power was threatened. The groundwork for Jesus' arrest and execution was being laid.

A little over two weeks ago, I had the privilege of being in the site of Lazarus' tomb. Now I can't help but think that that powerful experience was a sort of foreshadowing of the tomb of isolation we are all feeling now, but let us remember that our loving God will also raise us up (and out)all in God's time line. Meanwhile let us seek to have as much faith in God as God has in us.
