Pastor's Corner

Dear Beloved Parishioners,

The Church ends the Liturgical year with the feast of Christ the King. As people of faith, we believe that Christ is the King of kings. Our King does not isolate Himself from others by hiding in a castle. Rather our King goes out and travels from town to town to be with his people. He eats with them. He heals the sick and the ill. He teaches us how to be better. Ultimately, our King will sacrifice Himself to save us. He died so that we may live.

The end of the Liturgical year compels us to reflect upon how we lived our life. Did we serve our King by serving others as He serves them? Did we notice and acknowledge the least of our brothers and sisters in Christ by responding to their needs? Did we put God first in our life and trust in His providential care for us even in the midst of this pandemic. It is easy to give into despair and doubt rather than putting our faith and trust in the good Lord. He is with us. He is always with us. Nothing will separate us from the love of God. Nothing can.

Be resolved to continue to pray every day. Livestream or attend mass faithfully. Respond to the needs of others. Be hopeful. Everything will be alright because our King is watching over us. He is with us. Everything is in His hands. So are we.

We Believe

In today's gospel Jesus makes a theological statement about the nature of God. God is not a distant and removed being. God is right here among us, in the chaos and hardships of life. We see the face of God when we engage with the vulnerable, the marginalized, and the weak.

Jesus instructs us on how to care for one another, calling us to ask questions within ourselves. "What do I learn about God when I connect with those who suffer?" Jesus' presence in those who are in need connects us with the sacred and calls us into an all-encompassing humanity.

This end-of-the-Church-year gospel calls us out of complicit by standing. Honestly, I don't check where or how a piece of clothing is made when I purchase it, refill my plastic water bottle instead of tossing it, or check to see what the working conditions are for those who pick the fruit and vegetables that I eat. Many people deny that they are recipients of white privilege and close their ears to relevant human histories that have recently come into view. Today's gospel calls us out of the downfall of complicity and self-centeredness and into critical observation and loving action.

As we end the Church year and begin the season of Advent next Sunday, let us take a breathing space, a time to rethink how we can all be living signs of the resurrection. As we seek to find the face of Christ in others, let us move closer to realizing the Christ that has always, deep down, existed within ourselves.

Our Evolving Covid-19 Precautions During Mass

There are a few things you should know before you come: If you are at risk, either by age or health concerns, or if you are not feeling well, please do not attend. The archbishop has extended dispensation from Sunday obligation. Everyone over the age of 3 should wear a face covering (covering nose and mouth) Use the hand-sanitizers provided. Please maintain 6 feet distancing by following the marks on the floor, pews, and refrain from singing as tiny droplets can spread even through masks per California Public Health and San Mateo Guidelines.

Effective October 28th, 2020– The State of California has given permission for us to move Masses back inside the church buildings at 50% capacity (maintaining 6 feet separation) as San Mateo County is listed at Orange Risk Level. Inside 9:30am Mass at Our Lady of the Wayside is still temporarily cancelled. Thank you for your patience and understanding in helping us to protect parishioners and staff.

Effective since July 2020—with the increased outbreak of Covid-19 the California Department of Health guidelines are mandating no singing in public gatherings, including churches. We will have instrumental music.

Thank you for your patience and understanding in helping us to protect the parishioners and staff.

We will continue to live-stream the Mass Monday thru Friday at 8:00am and Sunday at 9:30am. It will be available on our parish website www.stdenisparish.org immediately following the Mass.

Communion will be distributed after the dismissal. We ask that everyone leave the parish grounds immediately after receiving communion.

We are excitedly looking forward to seeing you and being able to worship face to face, in community, with the Sacrament.
