

Pastor's Corner

We Believe

Dear Beloved Parishioners,

When I was in the military, especially during wartime, I came to the realization that the military with its three branches of service is like a massive machine. The Army, Navy/Marine Corps and Air Force have to work harmoniously to achieve its purpose. Equally as important is the need for each unit to work in conjunction with the others. Every person in a unit has an important role to play. That is how it is with the human body as well.

St. Paul in his Letter to the Corinthians uses the analogy of the human body to describe how the Church should function. The body has many parts. Each part of the human body is important and each part of the human body has a vital role to play. God did not make hands to see and God did not make ears to smell. God knew what He was doing when He created the human body. God also knew what He was doing when he gave us particular gifts and talents.

Each and every one of us has a role to play and each and every one of us is important to the life of the Church and to the world. Some are meant to be cantors while others are meant to play an instrument. Some are meant to be lectors while others are meant to be Eucharistic ministers to the sick. Some are meant to be teachers while others are meant to be in business or law or medicine. May we all fulfill our role with pride and joy, and do it in the name of the Lord.

This week we hear Luke's Gospel addressing someone named Theophilus. There are several theories as to who this individual might be. The name "Theophilus "literally means "friend of God," which has led many people to think that this is a generic title referring to all believers, but most biblical scholars believe that Luke was directing his Gospel and Acts to a specific individual.

Since Luke addresses Theophilus as "Most Excellent," we know this man had title or rank. This has led many to believe that Theophilus was a high-ranking Roman official. He could have also been a wealthy man from Antioch, where there is a second-century reference to a "great lord," a man of substantial wealth, living in Antioch at the time the gospel was written, in the 60's, BCE. Perhaps Theophilus acted as a benefactor to Luke, which would give Luke a strong inclination to share a detailed story of Jesus with him.

What is more important than knowing exactly who Theophilus really was is knowing Luke's intention in writing his detailed account. What was Luke's motivation? The evangelist of the gospel who wrote an account of the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus tells Theophilus and us the answer, "that you may have certainty concerning the things you have been taught. "As we listen to the "good news" of the Gospel readings each week, may we have that certainty.

Pope Francis's Synod Has Begun!

Pope Francis invites the whole Church to participate in a process to prepare for the upcoming <u>Synod of Bishops on Synodality</u>. This unprecedented opportunity will facilitate discussion and reflection to help shape the Church's understanding of herself and her mission of evangelization and forming disciples.

The Archdiocese of San Francisco will kick-off the local synodal process by asking every Catholic, active or not, to participate in the <u>Disciple Maker Index survey</u>. This survey will be available on line January 16 thru February 13, and there will be hard copies available in the church.

The process will continue in February and March with <u>listening sessions</u> offered throughout the Archdiocese and on-line. The Disciple Maker Index survey is a nationally recognized survey administered at parishes around the United States and Canada since 2013 by The Catholic Leadership Institute. The results will be used by our parish to help us plan for the future, so please participate!
