

I've come to see that the celebration of Jesus' rising from the dead is really about allowing Jesus to rise more meaningfully within me. The experience of Easter is a challenge to transform and grow in new and deeper ways.

Every time Jesus rises in our own hearts, the Resurrection happens again. It is not a "one time" event. Recognizing these Resurrections is recognizing where we might not have seen Christ before—in the marginalized, the unloved, and the unwanted of our world. The reality of the Resurrection lies not in Jesus' transformation from death into life, but in our on-going and deepening transformations from self-centeredness into love.


Catholic Relief Services Rice Bowls


