

# **About the Gospel**

Dear Beloved Parishioners,

If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts. His voice refers to God's voice. It is a voice worth hearing though. Yet, so many of us do not want to hear the very voice of God. We want to hear another voice, a voice that does not command us to transform our hearts and minds. We prefer to hear a voice that tells us what we want to hear rather than what we need to hear. We want to hear a voice that tells us that it is okay to do what we want to do rather than what we need to do.

God has lived a lot longer than we have or ever will. He is a fountain of wisdom and insight which we could tremendously benefit from. God is our Father who wants to pass on his wisdom and insight to us. It is better to turn the other cheek than to seek vengeance. Vengeance leads to violence which leads to the death of innocent human beings. Loving our neighbor as ourselves leads to peace. Hatred leads to division, chaos and destruction. If only we are willing to hear the voice of God.

We have no one to blame but ourselves for the problems of the world. We are the root of it, not God. He gives us all that we need. It is up to each and every one of us to live a life of faith. It is up to us to make the world a better place in which to live. We can only do that if we hear the voice of God and act on it. Love one another as I have loved you.

Today's gospel focuses on the importance of open communication, forgiveness, and the power of community in resolving conflicts. Matthew 18:15-20 is especially relevant for the times in which we live today, where misunderstandings, lies, exaggerations, and conflicts are so prevalent.

The need for open and honest communication in resolving problems is clear. Jesus tells us to address these issues directly with the person involved, rather than spreading rumors or fostering resentment.

Social media has added another layer of interaction and potential strife to our lives. In this age of online interactions and reactions, sometimes coupled with the ability to remain anonymous, it is even more crucial to approach conflicts with compassion, empathy, and a genuine willingness to listen. In a culture that values independence, violence, and revenge, Jesus teaches the value of forgiveness. For Jesus, it is not about winning or "having the last word," the goal is reconciliation and healing. The adage, "Hate the sin, but not the sinner," is a fitting approach to being loyal to our values and still respectful of others as followers of Christ.

Today's gospel also stresses the significance of community and the strength that can be found in coming together. Jesus promises that where two or three are gathered in his name, he is present. The power of collective action and the importance of supporting one another in times of conflict and difficulty are as essential to us today as it was for the survival of Jesus' first followers. As believers, we are challenged to promote healthy relationships and harmony wherever we find ourselves, giving real meaning to those familiar words, "Peace be with you."
