Pastor's Corner

About the Gospel

Dear Beloved Parishioners,

As hard as it may be to accept, God's ways are not our ways. If we are honest with ourselves, our ways may not always be fair or just. At times we tend to be stingy not only with our money, but also with our mercy and forgiveness. We only give what we believe someone deserves. Whenever I go out to dinner with my friends, I like to see how much they tip. Do they give 20% or 10%. Believe it or not, I always give 20%. This is quite remarkable given how stingy I am.

When our God gives, he gives in abundance. Were there not 12 wicker baskets full of food after multiplying the fish and loaves to feed five thousand people. The Psalms mentions that God is rich in mercy and full of compassion towards his people. In today's gospel passage, our God gives quite generously to the laborers, especially those he hires late in the day. The real meaning of hiring the laborers throughout the day is that God's mercy and forgiveness is given equally to all. Even to those who repent their sins late in their lives, up to their very last breath.

By the grace of God go I. Most of us live a faith filled life. Most of us live the teachings of Jesus, and stay on the straight and narrow path. Some though lose their footing by falling into temptation and sin. It does not take much to make the wrong choice and decision that leads us away from God. A little lie here or a little greed there. Unchecked, little sins add up. Before we know it, we have lost our way. Sometimes it takes nearly a life time for some people to come to their senses. When they do, should they not receive God's forgiveness and mercy as we have?

In Matthew 20:1-16, the "Parable of the Workers in the Vineyard," Jesus tells a story about a landowner who hires workers at different times during the day, but pays each worker the same wage, disregarding the number of hours they worked. The reaction of the workers who have put in a full day is justified by our usual standards, but Jesus is trying to get us to expand our judgments.

This parable illustrates God's generosity, who, like the landowner, is not bound by "the rules," a potent reminder that God's gifts are freely given to everybody and cannot be "earned." God's timing may not be our timing.

Today's gospel challenges our notions of fairness and justice. In God's view, everyone is deserving of God's love and blessings. This parable reminds us to avoid comparing ourselves to others. Our own relationship with God should our focus. When others receive God's blessings, it is not up to us to judge if they "deserve" them.

Finally, just as the different workers responded spontaneously to the owner's varied requests to work, so, too, are we challenged to answer God's call, no matter where or when, even when our time may be short.

Overall, the parable of the Workers in the Vineyard gives us the opportunity to reflect on our own attitudes. By examining more deeply our ideas about fairness, equality, and service, we can move towards cultivating a mindset of holy generosity that is more in tune with God's.
