

Pastor's Corner

About the Gospel

Dear Beloved Parishioners,

Today's first reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah reminds us that the Jewish people are the chosen People of God: "Israel, my chosen one, I have called you by your name, giving you a title, though you knew me not. I am the Lord and there is no other". In ancient times, surrounded by pagan nations, the Jewish people were the only ones who were monotheistic. They believed in only one God. The one and only God in the Book of Genesis who made heaven and earth. The one and only God who delivered the Israelites from slavery in Egypt. The one and only God who promised to send the Messiah.

The one and only God the Israelites believe in is the same one and only God we believe in as well. Our God fulfilled his promise to send the Messiah. He sent his son Jesus to free us from the slavery of sin, and to give us eternal life. I believe Jesus is the only one who sacrificed his very life by dying an agonizing death on a cross. I believe Jesus is the only one who taught to turn the other cheek, pray for your enemies and persecutors, love God and your neighbor as yourself and to forgive seven times seventy times which means always and forever.

I believe that Jesus is the way, the truth, and the life. His way is the way of peace. God's peace and love cannot reign in our hearts if we harbor hatred towards our neighbor. Our neighbor is not just the person living next to us. Our neighbor includes those who live down the street, on the opposite side of town, in another city, in another state and in another country. We are seeing what is happening before our very eyes when we do not follow the way of Jesus, death, and destruction. The Truth is that we are all made in the image and likeness of God. The annihilation of a race or nation is the greatest failure of believing in the one and only God. If only we truly believe and live it.

Today's Gospel presents the principle of living as responsible citizens while also remaining faithful to our spiritual beliefs. Finally, paying mindful attention to all the challenges that touch our lives can be a true opportunity of grace if we consciously seek God in all things. This cultivation of inner peace and harmony will bring that balance we desire. "Rendering to God, the things that are God's" really can become all-inclusive.
