

Gospel Reading

About the Gospel

Dear Beloved Parishioners,

A new Liturgical Year begins on this First Sunday of Advent. Last year has come and gone. Where did the time go? The older I get the faster time goes by. There is no stopping time let alone slow it down. Christmas will be here before we know it. What we do with each and every day is up to us. We can waste each day or we can make the most of it. It does not come back nor will it ever. Each day is gone forever. How we live each day if not each honor is so very important as people of faith.

The very words of Jesus in today's gospel passage is key for us in how to live each and every day. The good Lord emphatically tells us to "Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come." Essentially, we do not know when our life will end. It would be foolish to think that we will live forever or to think that we have plenty of time to change our ways therefore believing we can continue to live sinful lives.

According to our Catholic faith, there are Seven Deadly Sins: pride, greed, lust, envy, gluttony, wrath and sloth. Each Deadly Sin is deadly because each can lead to the ruin and demise of oneself and of others. It only takes one Deadly Sin to do us in. The Advent season is the time for us to stop and reflect upon our lives so as to change our hearts, to confess our sins and to change our behavior. There is no time to waste therefore. As disciples of Jesus, let's be squared away as is done in the military. Be good to go at a moments notice.

As we begin, this holy season of Advent, we might be tempted to bypass God's invitation to hope and holiness during this busy time of the year. When we're in a culture that constantly seems to focus on what's wrong with the world rather than what is going well, it's often challenging to be that hope-filled believer that God asks us to be.

Yet, breaking out of cynicism and the weariness it causes, is the recipe for a transformative and renewing experience.

If we reflect on the essential meaning of this liturgical season, Advent can speak to us about unfolding love, God's continuing love for us and our evolving response to God.

Advent offers us a chance to embrace some simplicity in a world filled with distractions and busyness, especially in the holiday season. This may also be a time to re-examine some of our attitudes about holiday expectations or prejudices against certain family members.

Advent is certainly a time to express our gratitude to our loving God, and to those who touch our lives in meaningful ways. In recognition of our Blessed Mother Mary, perhaps we might reflect on how we say yes to God in our daily lives. Advent is a call to reconnect with God, ourselves, and others. It is how we can "Stay awake!"

Catechist (Teacher) Needed!!


A catechist "echoes" the faith for others.
