January 7th, 2024 The Epiphany of the Lord

Pastor's Corner

The visit of the Magi occurs directly before the story of the Holy Family's flight into Egypt.

Matthew's Gospel tells a version of Jesus' birth that is different than the one in Luke. Of the actual birth of Jesus, Matthew tells us little more than, "When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod . . . " The story of the census is found only in Luke's Gospel, but we hear about the visit of the Magi only in Matthew's Gospel.

We know little about the Magi. They come from the East and journey to Bethlehem, following an astrological sign, so we believe them to be astrologers. We assume that there were three Magi based upon the naming of their three gifts. The Gospel does not say how many Magi paid homage to Jesus. In Matthew's Gospel, they represent the Gentiles' search for a savior. Because the Magi represent the entire world, they also represent our search for Jesus.

We have come to consider the gifts they bring as a foreshadowing of Jesus' role in salvation. We believe the meaning of the gifts to be Christological. Gold is presented as representative of Jesus' kingship. Frankincense is a symbol of his divinity because priests burned the substance in the Temple. Myrrh, which was used to prepare the dead for burial, is offered in anticipation of Jesus' death.

The word Epiphany means "manifestation" or "showing forth." Historically several moments in Christ's early life and ministry have been celebrated as "epiphanies," including his birth in Bethlehem, the visit of the Magi, his baptism by John, and his first miracle at Cana.

About the Gospel

The familiar story of the three wise men found in Matthew's gospel reminds us to be seekers of truth, willing to go out of our safe and familiar zones in our search to find the holy. The Magi were open to new revelations and they responded to finding Jesus by giving their best offerings, the gift of their actual visit and the gifts they brought along with them.

We are told that the Magi openly worshipped Jesus when they met this poor unlikely family. Their unbiased approach models respect and humility. The three kings were not Jews —but God led these foreigners to the Messiah, and they readily responded to this divine invitation. The child they found was not surrounded in the splendor customary bestowed on a king, but still he was recognized as God's gift to the world. This is a strong reminder to us to be open to revelation and to accept all people regardless of their background or status.

The star in this gospel account reminds us to pay attention to the signs and wonders God provides back then and now. King Herod responds to this divine invitation with jealousy and fear, demonstrating an all too familiar reaction when a particular world view is threatened. Pride, as demonstrated by Herod, and the greedy pursuit and maintenance of power are barriers to discovering faith and truth.

The story of the Magi encourages us to seek truth, worship God, embrace inclusivity, and trust divine guidance, admirable goals to incorporate into our lives as we begin 2024!
