About the Gospel

Dear Beloved Parishioners,

Only a few times have I had to tell some parishioners that priests, especially pastors have feelings too. Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words will always hurt me worse. God has feelings too. This is evident in today's first reading from the prophet Jeremiah. God is hurt because his people have broken his covenant time and time again. As we move closer towards Palm Sunday and Holy Week, we come face-to-face with our deep connection to the Paschal Mystery, the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The Paschal Mystery is the culmination of Jesus' earthly ministry and the core of our faith, the fullest expression of suffering, death, and eternal life. As followers of Christ, we are called to enter into the Paschal Mystery by living out the values Jesus' earthly life demonstrated—love, sacrifice, and the promise of eternal life.

Here are some suggestions to assist in our acknowledgment of the Paschal Mystery in our lives.

As the Lenten season winds down, we might make it a point to reflect on the depth of Jesus' love for humanity and ask ourselves how we can emulate his selfless love in our own relationships and interactions with others.

Connecting our sufferings and life challenges to Jesus' suffering and sacrifice can give us the hope and strength we need to get through them.

The Paschal Mystery highlights the importance of forgiveness and reconciliation. We are called to forgive others as God forgives us and to try to mend the broken relationships in our lives.

When we celebrate the resurrection, we embrace the essence of the Paschal Mystery and come to the spiritual reality of eternal life and the grace-filled hope that can be our companion on our own lifetime journey.

Our connection to the Paschal Mystery makes Jesus' story our story. Taking time to reflect on this can make the remaining days of this Lenten season a time of true holiness, hope, and blessing.
