

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend's reading has the well known story about Jesus healing the ten lepers and only one coming back to thank Jesus. The one who came back was a Samaritan, meaning he was not even one of the chosen people. There may be many reasons why the other nine did not thank Jesus for what he did for them. It could be they felt entitled because they were religious; it could be that they were so busy rejoicing that they forgot; it could be they ran to their family to share the good news; it could be that they do not think they needed to; or it could be that they might think that their healing was due to something other than Jesus.

Whatever the reasons for nine of the ten who were healed by Jesus to not come and thank Jesus, the Gospel focus' on their lack of expression of gratitude. It causes me to stop and think of the many things for which I thank God. The first and most important in my life for which I am grateful to God is being your pastor here. I tell people all the time how luck I am to be here with so many caring and wonderful people. Even among the challenges of four places to pastor, God has blessed me with loving and caring people in each place who would do anything for God and the parish. Therefore on this weekend with the proclamation of this Gospel, I need to thank God first for my vocation and my assignment here. Moreover, I have to thank so many of you for all that you do for your faith.

From Monday to Thursday, I will be at Marie Joseph Spiritual Center in Biddeford Pool to be on my yearly priest retreat required by Canon Law. The Church requires all priests to go on retreat for a week each year to pray and think about spiritual things. In the Church's wisdom, it asks this of the priests because it knows how easy it is to turn the vocation into just a job or the parish into a business. There are so may aspects of the priest life that is secular and business-like, but these activities are only a means to a greater end of building a community of faith with God at the center. A parish is first a place where communion is sought with God and each other as we journey through this life together. Please pray for me and know for sure that I will be praying for you this week.

Since I mentioned the business side of the parish, I wanted to update you on the capital projects happening at each Church site. The parking lot at Holy Martyrs should be starting this week. The new sign and the installing of LED lighting at Sacred Heart should be completed soon. New doors for the parish center at St. Gregory will hopefully be completed before the snow falls. We found someone to work on the sound system and microphones at St. Jude as well as the cabinet for Evelyn Frazer's small shop is almost completed. We are trying to stay ahead of the care of our buildings and grounds. Thank you to all who volunteered to help us care for our space.



"We are getting hit by Hurricane Matthew with a lot of rain and wind. It is going to be very difficult for Haiti which already is well acquainted with crises in economics, politics and natural disasters. The misery of our poor people will increase because they are only "gardeners" -- parce qu'ils ne sont que des jardiniers. Matthew has devastated everything. People will have difficulty feeding their families."




