I found this online from another parish and thought that it would be interesting to print in our bulletin. These are the small things we can often forget and it might be good from time to time to remind ourselves of these 12 Mass etiquette tips. It is intended just as a reminder. –Fr. Dan

Mass Etiquette:

<u>Fast before Mass.</u> It is Church law that one fasts for at least 1 hour before receiving Holy Communion. Water and medicine can be consumed, of course. The purpose is to help us prepare to receive Jesus in the Eucharist.

<u>Don't chew gum in church.</u> It breaks your fast, it's distracting, it is consider impolite in a formal setting, and it doesn't help us pray better. Can you imagine the Pope popping gum in during Mass?

Cross yourself with Holy Water on entering and leaving the church. This is a reminder of our Baptism, which made us members of Christ's Church. Just try to remain mindful of what is happening when you do so and don't do it without saying a prayer.

<u>Dress modestly and appropriately.</u> Wear your Sunday best. As Catholics we believe that God comes down to meet us at every Mass. So, why would we not dress up?

Show up at least a few minutes early. Getting to Mass early allows you to pray and prepare yourself better for Mass.

<u>Don't sit on the edge of the pew.</u> Rather, sit in the middle so others don't have to climb over you.

When we enter and leave Church, genuflect toward the

Tabernacle. Christ is present for our sake. By allowing our right knee to hit the floor, we acknowledge He is our Lord and God. If someone is physically unable to genuflect, then a bow

is sufficient. During Mass, if you pass in front of the altar or tabernacle, bow reverently.

No bulletin reading during Mass. Imagine if you invited a guest to your house and before dinner (or during) they decided to read a magazine instead of talking to you. That is what is happening in God's house when you read the bulletin.

Bow before receiving Holy Communion. If it is God, then show your respect with a bow of the head. This is an ancient practice that has continued until this day.

<u>Do not receive from the chalice if you are sick</u>. This is an act of charity and it is not necessary to receive in order to receive the entirety of Jesus' body, blood, soul, and divinity.

<u>Do not leave early.</u> We should stay to the end of the recession and the hymn that accompanies it, if there is one. While there are certainly exceptions to this guideline.

<u>Pray after Mass.</u> if you feel called to do so. It is a good custom to offer a prayer of thanksgiving after Mass is over.


