I remember it well – April 4, 1968, the day Martin Luther King Jr. was assassinated. I was completing the final semester of my seminary training. This was a tumultuous time in the history of our nation and our Church: the Vietnam War and Vatican Council II. It seemed that violence and uncertainty permeated our lives and our minds. It was a time of renewal and return to our origins as Catholics.

Martin Luther King Jr. was truly an instrument of the Lord's peace. His message, while disturbing to many, provoked a true sense of justice, that we are all brothers and sisters, that we must all care for one another, no matter the color of our skin, the language we speak, where we were born, what our sexual orientation may be.

The members of the Parish of the Holy Eucharist, distributed across a wide geographic area, worshipping as one in four different, yet similar, places, regularly and consistently demonstrate their care for one another and, indeed, for those in need outside the geographic area of our parish. POTHE parishioners are truly generous: for example, the recent Thanksgiving and Christmas food and gift giving efforts, our generous support for the needy here in Maine and elsewhere, and for our caring concern for the members of our sister parish in Haiti.

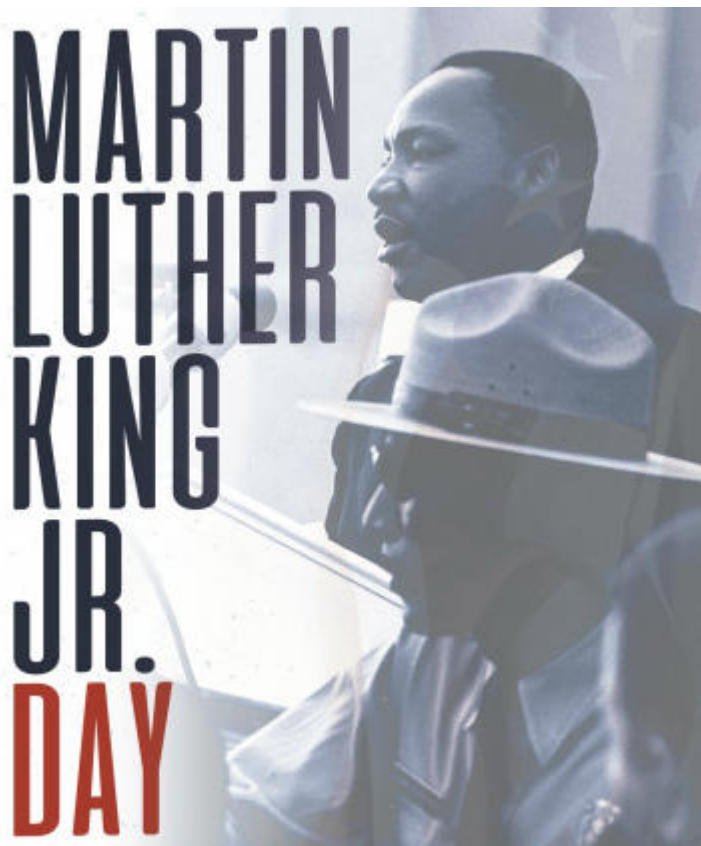
The legacy of Martin Luther King Jr., whether we realize it or not, permeates our souls and reminds us of his words:

THIS WEEK AT HOME

2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Our liturgical season's color is **GREEN**

JESUS' MIGHTY LOVE TRANSFORMS US

SCRIPTURE BACKGROUND:

Jesus begins his public life at a wedding feast at Cana in Galilee. He transforms an embarrassing problem of the hosts running out of wine into a triumph of hospitality! This wine becomes the best wine of the entire feast. His actions show us that he comes to gather people in joy. Jesus' mighty and truthful words and actions change the people and the world around them. This encourages us to follow Him and to do the same.

WE HEAR THE GOSPEL: JOHN 2:1-11

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told the them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from — although the servers who had drawn the water knew — the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.

WE PRAY: "Lord Jesus, help me to be obedient, as you were obedient to your mother. Teach me to listen to you and to do your will. Help me to be a saint, someone who always tries to be good and do good; thank you for your promise of eternal life. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen."

WE TALK: Is Jesus more like a guest at the wedding at Cana or more like the host of the wedding? What does the miracle of the abundant, plentiful wine say about Jesus? Why is hospitality important? Who is great at showing hospitality in your family, your school/workplace, church?

AGING WITH GRACE ~ WINTER SAFETY TIPS

Winter as we know it in Maine has arrived in full force. Cold weather and snowy conditions present numerous challenges, especially when you need to go outdoors.

Here are a few suggestions that will help you stay safe and connected:

Shovel Walkways: There's no point in taking a chance; avoid falls and injuries by connecting with someone to shovel your walkways and keep them free of snow and ice. Try a) hiring an industrious youth or landscaper looking for winter work; or b) Yarmouth residents may request help by calling YCAN, 838.2261.

Daily Check-In: You are invited to call your local Public Safety Office (police or fire departments) to let them know you are safe and have adequate heat and food. Cumberland residents, call 829.5491. Yarmouth residents, call 846.2406. If these departments don't hear from you by 9:00 am, they will check to make sure you are safe. OR make arrangements to call a friend or relative, or ask them to contact you every day. If they are unable to contact you, arrange for them to stop by or call your local Public Safety Office.

Avoid Driving: Try getting a ride via a local transportation service. Senior Rides, medical and non-medical, are available for Yarmouth residents through YCAN: 846.3887. In Cumberland, contact Sarah Davis: sdavis@cumberlandmaine.com for information re: ITN, RPN, or Volunteer Driver Program.

Stay Warm: Whether you're inside or outdoors, be sure to dress warmly with multiple layers of clothing. And, pardon me if I sound like your mother, but remember to wear your hat and gloves!

Prepare for Outages: We are all familiar with power outages and the challenges they bring. Make sure you have flashlights and fresh batteries readily accessible. If you have traded your land line in for a cell phone, have a car charger ready for use. Consider getting a battery-powered radio, too. Make arrangements for a neighbor to check in on you to insure you are safe and have everything you need.

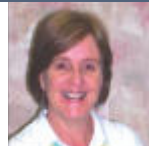
