### Your Guide to Lent at Parish of the Holy Eucharist...

#### BEST. LENT. EVER.

This coming week we celebrate Ash Wednesday which marks the beginning of the Church's season of Lent, and falls about 40 days before Easter. The 40 days of Lent represent Jesus' time in the desert and the 40 years the Israelites spent in exile after the Exodus.

We receive ashes on our foreheads this Wednesday and wear them as a sign of repentance, humility, and renouncing pride. We don't wear ashes to proclaim our holiness, but to acknowledge that we sin and are in need of Repentance and Renewal. Which is what Lent is all about.

**During Lent,** we focus our attention on three practices:

#### Fasting, Giving, Praying

We **FAST** because depriving ourselves of a basic necessity reminds us of our utter dependence on God. And traditionally, the money saved from our various fasts is intended to be given to the needy.

We **GIVE** because all that we are given by God isn't meant just for us, but rather for us to share with others and for the service of others.

And finally, we **PRAY** because we are not totally self-sufficient. We have a need inside of us that can't be filled by ourselves or others. We have a longing, a holy longing, and must look to God.

During Lent, to help us on our journey, we must also look to the **Community** that surrounds us. Here at POTHE, that is our parish community. Without a community, we cannot be enriched by others or enrich them. Only in the context of community can we continue to find and grow our relationship with God.

The POTHE Community has many exciting and fulfilling experiences, events and opportunities planned to help you with your fasting, giving and praying practices for Lent this year. Use this bulletin as a guide, take it home and keep it on hand. And together we really can make this the best Lent ever.

#### **FASTING & ABSTINENCE DURING LENT**

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from eating meat. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

#### **DAILY MASS**

Consider making the commitment to go to daily Mass during Lent. Beginning on Ash Wednesday, Holy Martyrs offers a special 5:30pm daily Mass, Mondays-Fridays in place of the usual 7:30am M/W/F Mass, as a convenience for those who work during the day.

WHICH ONE OF JESUS' 5 QUOTES DO I NEED TO THINK ABOUT? Learn Jesus' 5 quotes this week, read this Gospel story with your family: Luke 6:39-45

#### **GOSPEL BACKGROUND:**

Jesus gives us five vivid quotes or sayings to reflect on. Our Catholic Catechism (what our Church believes and teaches), says: "The education of the conscience is a lifelong task. It guarantees freedom and engenders peace of heart. In the formation of conscience the Word of God is the light for our path". Each day is an opportunity for us to exercise our conscience so it grows stronger. Small daily efforts lead to a strong conscience.

#### **FOLLOW THESE STEPS AT HOME:**

WE PRAY: "Lord Jesus, help me to open my mind and heart to think about what you are teaching me this week. Help me to be the best person I can be before I judge others. I ask the angels and saints to pray for me and with me. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen".

WE TALK: How is our life like a tree which bears good fruit? What quote of Jesus' can I work on this week? What quotes do your parents, or grandparents or other people in your life have? Which one do I really like and why?

#### FIRST READING

#### DEUTERONOMY 26:4-10

Moses spoke to the people, saying: "The priest shall receive the basket from you and shall set it in front of the altar of the LORD, your God. Then you shall declare before the Lord, your God, 'My father was a wandering Aramean who went down to Egypt with a small household and lived there as an alien. But there he became a nation great, strong, and numerous. When the Egyptians maltreated and oppressed us, imposing hard labor upon us, we cried to the LORD, the God of our fathers, and he heard our cry and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression. He brought us out of Egypt with his strong hand and outstretched arm, with terrifying power, with signs and wonders; and bringing us into this country, he gave us this land flowing with milk and honey. Therefore, I have now brought you the first fruits of the products of the soil which you, O LORD, have given me.' And having set them before the Lord, your God, you shall bow down in his presence.

The Word of the Lord

#### Commentary on Deuteronomy:

This reading from the Book of Deuteronomy was part of a thanksgiving liturgy that included the ritual offering to God of the first fruits from the land. Moses tells the people to give to the priest these first fruits and place them before the altar. Accompanying the gifts was a retelling of the saving history of the Israelite people from the Egyptian oppression to freedom in the Promised Land. The Israelites were to give the first fruits as a thanksgiving to God for the harvest received from the land they were given by God. This event included an act of humility by bowing in God's presence, showing their belief that all the good they had received came from God.

#### Questions for Understanding & Discussion

- Describe how the Mass finds its roots in the Israelite liturgy of thanksgiving described in today's reading?
- 2. How do you express your thankfulness for all the good you have received from God?



#### RESPONSORIAL PSALM

Ps 91:1-2, 10-11, 12-13, 14-15

R. Be with me, Lord, when I am in trouble.

You who dwell in the shelter of the Most High, who abide in the shadow of the Almighty, say to the LORD, "My refuge and fortress, my God in whom I trust." R.

No evil shall befall you, nor shall affliction come near your tent, For to his angels he has given command about you, that they guard you in all your ways **R**.

Upon their hands they shall bear you up, lest you dash your foot against a stone. You shall tread upon the asp and the viper; you shall trample down the lion and the dragon. R.

Because he clings to me, I will deliver him; I will set him on high because he acknowledges my name. He shall call upon me, and I will answer him; I will be with him in distress; I will deliver him and glorify him. R.

#### SECOND READING

#### ROMANS 10:8-13

Brothers and sisters: What does Scripture say? The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart —that is, the word of faith that we preach—, for, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For one believes with the heart and so is justified, and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved. For the Scripture says, No one who believes in him will be put to shame. For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all, enriching all who call upon him. For "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

The Word of the Lord

#### Commentary on Romans:

This text from Paul's Letter to the Romans is to be seen against the backdrop of the Jewish understanding of The Law. Paul is addressing the Jewish notion that one is justified and saved by keeping The Law. However, with Christ, salvation is a gift that comes with believing in Jesus

Christ crucified, died and raised. Once one believes, one professes this belief and acts on it. One follows The Law because one believes in the gift given by Jesus. Paul spells out the process of salvation: to believe in the heart and to profess with the lips that Jesus Christ is the Risen Lord. The point is that we must externalize what we believe internally; there has to be an external reality to faith that begins internally. Moreover, this gift of faith and salvation offered by Jesus is now open to all people who believe and live out their faith in Jesus.

#### Questions for Understanding & Discussion

- 1. According to Paul, how is one saved?
- 2. How is YOUR life different because of your faith?

#### GOSPEL READING

LUKE 4:1-13

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days, to be tempted by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and when they were over he was hungry. The devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become bread." Jesus answered him, "It is written, One does not live on bread alone." Then he took him up and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in a single instant. The devil said to him, "I shall give to you all this power and glory; for it has been handed over to me, and I may give it to whomever I wish. All this will be yours, if you worship me." Jesus said to him in reply, "It is written: You shall worship the Lord, your God, and him alone shall you serve." Then he led him to Jerusalem, made him stand on the parapet of the temple, and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, for it is written: He will command his angels concerning you, to guard you, and: With their hands they will support you, lest you dash your foot against a stone." Jesus said to him in reply, "It also says, You shall not put the Lord, your God, to the test." When the devil had finished every temptation, he departed from him for a time. The Gospel of the Lord

#### Commentary on Luke:

Jesus defines his mission by rejecting false versions of what some thought the Messiah would be and do. Each of the three temptations point to false ideas of the messiah and Jesus' win over the temptations speak about the kind of Messiah Jesus is to be. The devil appears at the end of Jesus' time in the desert when he is at his weakest point reminding us that in the weak moments of our lives, temptations to turn from God are at their strongest.

In the first temptation, the devil taunts Jesus by questioning his identity. The evil one says, "If you are the Son of God...", something that was claimed just a chapter earlier at Jesus' baptism when a voice came from heaven that stated that Jesus is the Father's beloved Son in whom He is well pleased." If he is, then he can do all that he wants. Jesus' response is that as the Son of God, He is to do only the will of his Father in heaven. The temptation Jesus faces is

one of distorting the divine mission for his own personal gain. We too face the same temptations to distort our faith for our own personal gain rather than be consumed with doing the will of God in our lives.

In the second temptation, the devil offers Jesus all worldly power and glory if He worships the evil one. This challenges Jesus to exercise power in a secular, political manner to advance himself in this world. Some Jewish people had hoped that the messiah would be a political leader who brought with him a new kingdom of this world. However, Jesus brings God's kingdom not by temporal control and power but by conversion and forgiveness. In this Jesus serves only his Father in heaven, he does not serve the goals of worldly ideals.

In the third temptation, Jesus is told to give proof that he is the Son of God and to force his Father to act on his behalf. In this way, Jesus will exercise his power to dazzle and charm the people. Jesus' response is that he will not test his Father, like the Israelites did in the desert. Instead, he will remain obedient to his Father, trusting in his will for Jesus. It should be noted that in this third temptation, the devil quotes scripture reminding us that God's word can be perverted for one's one benefit.

Luke concludes the temptation scene by stating that the devil left for a time, which hints that he will appear again later in the Gospel. Jesus had won this battle but there is more to come.

#### Questions for Understanding & Discussion

- 1. In what ways do the temptations Jesus faced and his responses to them, help us to correct any false notions we may have of who the Messiah is?
- 2. What do you do to resist temptations you face to turn away from God?

### KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS ~ FAITH IN ACTION FOR MEMBERS AND NON-MEMBERS

Your Knights of Columbus are part of the largest Catholic Family Fraternal Organization in the world. Here are several things every Catholic man & his family should know about this organization!

- It all started when a parish priest wanted to help Catholic families.
  The year was 1882 and anti-Catholic sentiment was running high.
  Catholic immigrants faced hostility and were thrown into dangerous
  work conditions which could cause early deaths. So, 29-year-old Fr.
  Michael McGivney gathered the men of St. Mary Church in New
  Haven, Connecticut, to establish a lay organization that would unite
  men of Catholic faith & provide for families of deceased members.
