

LIVE IN GOD'S LOVE

Several years ago I took a cruise through the Panama Canal. I was fascinated to see the series of locks in action. The ship would go into the lock and both ends would close. Water was added to



allow the ship to enter a lake that was higher than the previous one, or water was taken out to allow the ship to cruise into a lower body of water. Ships of that size are fitted with watertight compartments. In the event of a hull breach, sections of the ship can be closed off to contain the rushing water and hopefully prevent the ship from sinking. Jesus' teaching in this week's Gospel is a kind of spiritual application of these principles. Jesus instructs us that if we wish to avoid grave sin, we often must block off lesser actions and attitudes to protect ourselves. We don't usually wake up and decide to commit murder or adultery. There is usually a period where we allow anger and lust to take over our lives. We find reasons to objectify a person to justify increased antagonism or interest. If we want to live a life of virtue, we often need to shut ourselves off from damaging relationships and poor thinking. When we shut ourselves off from prayer, good relationships, and the sacraments, we make it easier to descend into sin and bad judgement. Practically speaking, we need to be able to monitor our lives. Sometimes we need to close off our past and believe that God's mercy has forgiven us. Perhaps we need to shut down our concern for what the future may hold, so we can concentrate on the present and not live in fear. We need to surround ourselves with good friends and mentors and keep away from people who will bring us down. The more we prevent little sins from cascading into larger ones, the better chance we have to live in God's love. I invite all of us to consider what it will take to elevate our lives more to God, and to avoid sinking further from God. Look at what aspects in your life may need to be isolated and strengthened. Do not just be satisfied that you have avoided the big sins in life. Examine what may be churning under the surface so that those larger sins can always be avoided.

Given the fact that Deacon Dennis is working twenty hours a week now, and in an effort to be more available to the northern part of our parish, I am contemplating adding some office hours at St. Gregory's. This will allow me to meet with parishioners, coordinate visitations, etc. I am currently looking at possible times on Tuesdays or Wednesdays. I am open to suggestions as to whether a morning or afternoon period would be more effective. Please email me in the coming weeks to let me know, or to set something up.

Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Our Liturgical Color is GREEN
This week's theme: "MAKE PEACE"

Gospel of Matthew 5:17-37

Themes of this Sunday's Gospel:

The Law of Moses contains 613 laws. Some of these laws are "you-shall or you-shall-not" commands and are similar to the Ten Commandments. Some of these laws govern worship. A good many of the 613 laws are "what-if" laws that apply the Commandments to everyday life. In the Gospel, Jesus' New Law asks that while the people follow the laws, they especially follow his new Law of Love.

Family Prayer: Pray the Lord's Prayer together: "Our Father, who art in heaven..."

Family Gospel Conversations for Youth Faith Development:

Ages 3-4,5-6: Rules give children a way to know they belong. They experience rules by being members of a family or community that keep the same rules they do. Talk about family rules with your child. Share why the rules are important for everyone. Do these rules apply to the world too? Why does God gives us the Ten Commandments?

Ages 7-8: with your guidance, your child has already learned to recognize good moral actions. Help your child learn God's Ten Commandments and how they help all to do what is right. Talk about how Jesus' teaching deepens the Commandments, and how the rules you have in your family help all of you make right decisions and care for one another.

Ages 9-11, 12-14: Discuss with your youth the similarity between the Ten Commandments and the rules every family needs to live by; are a family's rules so different from the rules of a healthy society? Why did God establish a moral code for humanity? Ask what difficult situations your youth has faced, when she/he chose to follow her/his conscience and the consequences when she/he did or did not. Talk about how you can apply Jesus' Law of Love to the arguments and conflicts your family might have. Take a few moments to ask one another's forgiveness for hurtful words or actions.
