"My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love you above all things and I desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already there and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen."

GOD DWELLS WITHIN EACH OF US

Gerald Fuller shares this story. Dorothy Pryse was listening to a Christian radio station as she drove to the grocery store one morning. A person was talking about kindness. Then he said,

"I wonder how many of you are listening to me on your car radio and thinking of how you can be kind while driving?" Dorothy began thinking about what he was saying. A few blocks away, she saw a woman waiting in her car to come out of her driveway. Traffic was heavy; Dorothy knew this woman would have a hard time getting out. She slowed down to let her out. The woman smiled and waved at her.

When she got to the grocery store she saw a parking space. As she started pulling in, another car on the opposite side also started pulling in. Dorothy backed out and found another parking spot. As they both got out of their cars, the driver of the other car said, "I can't believe what you just did. Anyone else would have made me back out."

Dorothy explained what she had heard on the radio about showing love. The two women began talking. Dorothy discovered the woman had just moved into the area, didn't know anyone and was looking for a church. "I invited her to come to our Church, Dorothy says, "and a strong friendship has blossomed from our chance meeting and a small act of kindness." (Stories for All Seasons pg 21)

Jesus promises that we will not be orphans. God dwells within each of us. When we think about God's love within us, we may be tempted to think about the heroic opportunities that we need help: forgiving our arch nemesis, walking away from serious sin and addiction, coping with a loved one who has abandoned the faith, etc. When we stumble in these great moments, we falsely conclude that God is not really present, or that we are somehow not worthy. The more obvious reality is that we need to grow in our appreciation and understanding of God's indwelling. That happens when we have small moments of grace, as in the above story. Two simple gestures, each taking less than a minute, united with God's presence, could have made a profound impact in these lives.

This week, in preparation for the great Solemnity of Pentecost, instead of wondering where the overwhelming moments of the Spirit are in your life, focus on the smaller moments. Intentionally imagine an act of kindness that you can offer to someone and do it. See if you can recognize how God will use that moment to strengthen your faith and be present in the life of someone else.

Sixth Sunday of Easter

Our Liturgical Color is White This Week's Theme: HOLY SPIRIT, COME!

Gospel of John 14: 15 - 21

OUR FAMILY PRAYS: "In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. Risen Jesus, Father in Heaven, Holy Spirit, we believe that you are ONE GOD. When we spend time with you, we grow to understand relationships. Thank you for being with us on this earth, through the Holy Spirit. We thank you for keeping us safe, healthy, patient and trusting. In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen."

SCRIPTURE BACKGROUND: In today's Gospel, Jesus continues his Last Supper conversation with the Apostles. He promises to return to them after his Death and Resurrection (He does! from New Testament accounts, before his Ascension to Heaven, Jesus appeared at least 10 times to his disciples and various groups during a period of about 40 days; he also later appeared to Saul - St. Paul, after his Ascension). At this supper, Jesus also promises that after his Ascension to his Father in heaven, he will continue to be with them through a helper, an advocate, called **the Holy Spirit**.

What is Jesus' point? He is telling them and us that he (God) will never abandon us, that he will not leave us orphans. He does not promise perfection or earth (this is reserved for Heaven). He promises that no matter what happens in our lives, the Holy Spirit (God) will help us through everything, because he loves us. Jesus asks us to trust him. He is faithful to us, always, through thick and thin!

OUR FAMILY SHARES CONVERSATION: When Italian St. Catherine of Sienna thought about the fish that live in the sea, she was a beautiful symbol of the existence we have in God. She wrote that every human being is both surrounded by God and filled with God, "like the fish in the sea and the sea in the fish".

- 1. What does this mean to me?
- 2. Can a fish live without water? What does water do for fish?
- 3. Do I have another way or image to describe how God is essential to our existence?
- 4. How does God work on earth to show his love for us? Give some real live examples!
- 5. Do I trust that Jesus is truthful in his presence?

MAY 21ST, THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD

The Ascension of our Lord is an event that is commemorated by a feast day, usually Thursday in the Sixth Week of Easter. It's also one of the Glorious Mysteries of the Rosary.

As Jesus told His Apostles right before His Ascension "Thus it is written...that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in his [Christ's] name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You yourselves are witnesses of these things" (Luke 24:46-48).

He also said: "You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, [see Acts 2:1-11] and you shall be witnesses for me in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria and even to the very ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8).

This prayer below brings our Lord's stirring words to mind:

Dear Lord Jesus Christ, right before your Ascension into heaven you told your apostles to be His witnesses to the ends of the earth upon receiving the Holy Spirit. May I be similarly inspired to spread your Gospel message in word and deed, according to your will for me. And may I do so prudently and joyfully, with your help, your guidance, and your grace! And remembering this glorious event, help me to seek what is above, Heaven, where you are seated at the right hand of God the Father!

Our Lord must commission His apostles, and by extension His disciples as well, to go forward and spread his teaching once they've been baptized by the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. (Scripture only mentions the apostles as being present for this wondrous event, but there are Church approved private revelations that mention His Disciples as being there as well.)

Upon the promised descent of the Holy Spirit ten days later the once timid Apostles and Disciples went boldly forth to proclaim Jesus' Good News of mankind's redemption and salvation, as St. Luke recounts in the book of Acts.

One of the last lines in the first Ascension Day reading at Mass reminds me that we have to play our part in our salvation, in living a life of loving obedience to our Lord and His Commandments. We see Jesus' Apostles and perhaps disciples, looking up in amazement as "he was lifted up before their eyes, and a cloud took him out of their sight" (Acts 1:9).

Suddenly two men dressed in white say to them "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up to heaven? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, shall come in the same way as you have seen him going up to heaven" (Acts 1:11).

In other words, "Stop standing around gawking, and wondering when Christ might come back, and get busy with what He wants you to do!" And that applies to all of us as well, each in our own ways. 'Go.....'






