



#### **HELP YOUR FAMILY TO AIM HIGH**

Michelangelo once wrote, "The greater danger for most of us lies not in setting our aim too high and falling short, but in setting our aim too low, and achieving our mark."



Jesus in today's Gospel challenges us to remain faithful to him by speaking the truth, avoiding sinful behavior, and witnessing to his presence in our lives. We can dilute this teaching by being minimalistic. We convince ourselves that our lies do not really hurt anyone. I act much better than my friends and family, so I am at least better than they are. My belief in God is private. All of these derive from our weakened human nature. However, when we rationalize our behavior, we are not necessarily motivated to improve. We are satisfied that others are worse than I am, instead of being inspired to be better like someone else.

On this Father's Day, I celebrate my father's influence in reinforcing this teaching of the Lord. He recognized that his five sons had very different personalities, interests, and skills. He did not expect the same grades or athletic excellence from all of us. He did expect us to do our best and to push ourselves to do better. He was not upset if we were not first in our class or on our team. He did insist that we measure ourselves by those ahead of us and not those behind us.

Dad was also not someone to be silent. He loved working on the railroad. He was passionate about the safety of others and the plight of those with less seniority than him. He was such a frequent letter write to the Portland Press Herald or Church World on issues that one of my priest friends referred to him as the theologian of Pine Street. Almost all these letters referenced his faith and how it shaped his thoughts and evaluation of actions.

My dad did not read Dr. Spock's book on parenting. He did not take psychology classes in a college. He had loving, faith filled parents who formed him and provided good example. On this Father's Day, may each of us take the time to honor and thank our fathers, living and deceased. Statistically, there are probably many things that they could have done better or experiences that you wished might have been a part of your relationship with him. We can acknowledge this and maybe we need to seek healing. However, focus on that for which you are grateful, that taught you how to be a good child, loving parent and faith filled disciple.

My mom and my brothers never tire of retelling the stories and wisdom of J. P. Tracy, in part because he can no longer speak coherently, and in part because we never want to forget that wisdom and love. I encourage you to share your stories. As fathers, I encourage you to ask the questions that you need to ask, and to lovingly consider the advice of Michelangelo and teaching of Jesus. Help your family to aim high, and be there in love and support when they miss the mark.

STORIES THAT HELP US GROW IN FAITH!



Fr. Augustus Tolton was the first black Catholic priest in our country. Augustus was born into slavery. His parents were Catholic. Augustus, his mother, and three brothers and sisters escaped to the North where they could live as free people. When he was a still a young boy, Augustus wanted to serve the world and the Church and he knew that God wanted him to be a priest. But none of the schools for priests, called seminaries, would let him study there because he was Black He had to go all the way to Italy so he could become a priest. Even though he was a good priest, some people did not like him just because of his skin color. After he finished going to school, Augustus was ordained and became Fr. Augustus. It was a great day for the Church and for him! Even though many tried to stop him, he kept trying. He showed people he loved God every day. He was a great speaker and was very generous. Fr. Augustus wanted to make sure all children had the ability to go to school. He helped raise money for the parish school. Some people would not let Fr. Augustus stay and they made him leave that town because they did not like that he was Black. Many people would have given up, but not Fr. Augustus. With God's help and the support of other people, he found a new home in Chicago, where he spent his life helping the poor. He is a great example of how a trusting servant of God, can help the world, even when it is difficult. In 2019, Pope Francis added Father Augustus Tolton on the path to sainthood. He is now Venerable Fr. Augustus. Two more steps to sainthood! (adapted from Open Wide Our Hearts—USCCB)

As Christ-centered persons, let us reflect on how each of us can be positive forces which will help to change our world's hurtful ways, through honest conversations, respectful listening, and unified actions.

## "Virtual" Maine Catholic Youth Convention Set for July 26

The Maine Catholic Youth Convention will move online for 2020, but it still promises to be a great event celebrating the faith and gifts that young people bring to the life of the Church.

"The Catholic Youth Leadership Team has been working hard at trying to create an event that has traditionally been a three-day gathering into a two-hour gathering," said Shawn Gregory, coordinator of youth ministry for the Diocese of Portland.



That free gathering will now be presented virtually on Sunday, July 26, from 10 a.m. to noon. High school youth (those entering ninth grade through recent high school graduates), youth ministers, and families are encouraged to attend. The virtual convention will feature a live-streamed Mass celebrated by Bishop Robert Deeley, music, presentations, prayer, and much more.

Though the event is free, a donation to the Catholic Appeal (www.portlanddiocese.org/Appeal) is suggested for families looking to support the event and the Office of Lifelong Faith Formation, both made possible by the Appeal.

Two ways are being offered to young people who wish to participate in the virtual convention. "The first option allows you to watch live on July 26 and interact with others who are participating in this live event from their parishes or the comfort of their own homes," said Hannah Gonneville, assistant coordinator of the Diocese of Portland's Office of Lifelong Faith Formation. "The second option will be to watch a recorded version of the convention that teens can view with their parish youth ministry at a date and time that works best."

Registration is simple. Participants need only to email Shawn Gregory at shawn.gregory@portlanddiocese.org. He will send the appropriate link (live or recorded) to the participants.

"COVID-19 has challenged us to look at things differently," said Lori Dahlhoff, director of the Office of Lifelong Faith Formation. "But our faith unites us, our hope lifts us, and our love sustains us. It will be wonderful to gather virtually and celebrate being Catholic in our faith, hope & love."

## Free Basilica Summer Concert Series Returns to Lewiston on July 8

July 22 Ray Cornils - Cornils was the municipal organist for the City of Portland from 1990 to 2017. In addition to his solo work, he performs regularly with the Portland Symphony Orchestra.

July 29 Harold Stover - Stover is a graduate of the Juilliard School in New York, and a charter member of the faculty of the Portland Conservatory of Music. His performance will include pieces by Couperin, Messiaen, and Guilmant.


